DECISION AND ORDER ON COST AWARDS

Wasaga Distribution Inc. ("Wasaga"), a licensed distributor of electricity, filed an application with the Ontario Energy Board (the "Board") on September 28, 2010 under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, S.O. 1998, c. 15, (Schedule B), seeking approval for changes to the rates that Wasaga charges for electricity distribution, to be effective May 1, 2011. The Board assigned the application file number EB-2010-0143.

The Vulnerable Energy Consumers Coalition ("VECC") was granted cost award eligibility for participation in the proceeding related to Wasaga's request for lost revenue adjustment mechanism and shared savings mechanism recoveries.

The Board issued its Decision and Order on the application on March 17, 2011, in which it set out the process for VECC to file its cost claims and to respond to any objections raised by Wasaga.

On March 31, 2011, the Board received VECC's cost claim. No comments were received from Wasaga.

The Board has reviewed VECC's cost claim and finds that VECC is eligible for 100% of its reasonably incurred costs of participating in this proceeding. The Board finds that VECC's claim is reasonable and Wasaga shall reimburse VECC for its costs.

THE BOARD ORDERS THAT:

1. Pursuant to section 30 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, Wasaga shall immediately pay the Vulnerable Energy Consumers Coalition the sum of \$1,543.51.
2. Pursuant to section 30 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, Wasaga shall pay the Board's costs of and incidental to, this proceeding immediately upon receipt of the Board's invoice.
