Notice of Motion for a Review and Variance of the November 3, 2008

Decision with Reasons

We are counsel to Power Workers' Union. Power Workers' Union was an Intervenor in EB-2007-0905.

We are in receipt of Mr. Barrett's correspondence to the Board dated January 28, 2009, together with OPG's Notice of Motion to vary the OEB's decision of November 3, 2008. We understand that the OPG is seeking to review and vary the OEB's decision of November 3, 2008 in EB-2007-0905, and is seeking an oral hearing of its motion to vary that decision.

The PWU supports OPG's request for an oral hearing of its motion. In the event the OEB conducts such a hearing, the PWU intends to support OPG's position on the merits of that motion.

The PWU submits that OPG has raised a serious issue regarding the process by which the OEB arrived at a significant aspect of its decision in EB-2007-0905. The PWU supports OPG's submission that the OEB's analysis and disposition of the regulatory tax loss and mitigation issue was never advanced at the hearing by OEB staff, intervenors, OPG or the OEB itself. Not only was OPG deprived of the opportunity to respond to the OEB's approach to this issue, the PWU and other participants in the proceeding were likewise deprived of their opportunity to respond to the OEB's approach on this issue.

As an intervenor in EB-2007-0905, and as a regular intervenor in electricity proceedings at the Board, the PWU is concerned that the Board's handling of this issue was not in accordance with it's obligations of natural justice to the parties to

the proceeding. The PWU submits that this is a significant issue which warrants an oral hearing on the merits.
