Decision on Cost Eligibility

On February 19, 2008, the Ontario Energy Board (the "Board") issued a letter announcing that it would consider options for the review and disposition of Account 1588 of the Uniform System of Accounts, the only variance account associated with the commodity of electricity. Further, the Board indicated that it would consider using disposition thresholds or "disposition triggers" for disposing of the balances in Account 1588. The Board also noted that it might extend this initiative to other electricity distributors' variance and deferral accounts ("Accounts") that are similar in nature to Account 1588.

On April 1, 2009, the Board issued a staff discussion paper setting out Board staff's initial thoughts on a framework for the review and disposition of all the Accounts. Board staff prepared this discussion paper to invite written comments from all interested parties for determining if, when, and how Account balances should be disposed of. Informed by Board staff's discussion paper and interested parties' comments, it is expected that the Board will issue guidelines on the Accounts' review and disposition processes.

The cover letter accompanying the staff discussion paper notified interested parties that cost awards would be available to eligible persons under section 30 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998* and that any costs awarded would be recovered from all rate-regulated licensed electricity distributors based on their respective distribution revenues. The cover letter also indicated that the rates of licensed distributors Cornwall Street Lighting and Power Company and Dubreuil Forest Products are not currently fixed or approved by the Board, and cost awards will not be recovered from these two distributors.

Parties Eligible for a Cost Award

The Board received requests for cost eligibility from the following interested parties:

- Association of Major Power Consumer in Ontario ("AMPCO");
- Consumers Council of Canada ("CCC");
- London Property Management Association ("LPMA");
- School Energy Coalition ("SEC"); and
- Vulnerable Energy Consumers' Coalition ("VECC")

Electricity distributors were given an opportunity to file any objections they might have in relation to the eligibility of the above-noted participants for an award of costs. The Board has not received any objections from distributors. A list of all registered participants is attached to this Decision as Appendix A.

Based on the criteria set out in section 3 of the Board's *Practice Direction on Cost Awards*, the Board has determined that AMPCO, CCC, LPMA, SEC and VECC are eligible for an award of costs.
