**Re: Transition from Regulated Price Plan to Ontario's Market Price

Please be advised that effective November 1, 2009 most municipalities, universities, schools and hospitals and other designated customers who are still on the Regulated Price Plan (RPP) will start to pay Ontario's market price for the energy portion of their bills. Please see the enclosed brochure, which provides more information regarding this change. Customers can now voluntarily come off the Regulated Price Plan before November 1, 2009. Customers can also request to have an interval meter installed in order to pay the hourly electricity price as opposed to the weighted average electricity price, as explained in the brochure.
