**Re: Request for Intervenor Status

Enbridge Gas Distribution Inc. Leave to Construct**

In response to the Ontario Energy Board's ("OEB") Notice of Application and Hearing for Enbridge Gas Distribution Inc.'s ("Enbridge") Application for leave to construct a natural gas pipeline ("Application") to supply gas to York Energy Centre ("YEC"), we are requesting intervenor status on behalf of York Energy Centre LP ("York").

York has a direct interest in this proceeding because it was awarded a contract to construct, own and operate the YEC by the Ontario Power Authority ("OPA") on December 11, 2008 following a Request for Proposal ("RFP") bid evaluation process. It also recently filed its Statement of Completion in relation to the Ontario Environmental Assessment process. The YEC is a natural gas-fired simple cycle electricity generation facility and commercial operations are anticipated to commence by the end of 2011. Securing a reliable source of natural gas will be critical to the operations of the YEC and York is supportive of Enbridge's Application.

As evidenced by York's successful participation in the RFP and Environmental Assessment processes, Enbridge's Application is in the public interest because it is vital to the YEC. The YEC will supply new power generation to meet peak electricity demand in the northern York Region, provide increased security and reliability to the grid in this area, and will also assist the government of Ontario to meet its goal of displacing coal-fired generation. Furthermore, the YEC will provide direct and indirect employment and economic benefits to the northern York Region. In addition, there will be a net benefit to air quality because natural gas is a cleaner fuel source than coal and will assist with Ontario's efforts to combat climate change by shifting away from coal-fired generation to less carbon-intense generation sources.

York wishes to actively participate in this proceeding through the provision of both oral and written submissions, arguments and supporting information. York also wishes to receive evidence and other material submitted by participants in the hearing. York will not be seeking costs for involvement in this process.


