### **DECISION AND ORDER**

Ontario Power Generation Inc. ("OPG") filed an application on August 12, 2009 with the Ontario Energy Board pursuant to section 74 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act*, 1998 to amend Schedule 1 of the electricity generator licence, EG-2003-0104. The application was revised on August 26, 2009.

The requested amendment is to remove the following generating stations from the list of licensed facilities:

- Sandy Falls Generating Station;
- Lower Sturgeon Generation Station; and
- Hound Chute Generation Station.

OPG stated that these facilities, and the associated assets, will be transferred from OPG to UMH Energy Partnership around the time that commercial operation is achieved for the generating stations. An application by UMH Energy Partnership for a new electricity generation licence to own and operate these generating stations was received by the Board on August 11, 2009.

I have proceeded to decide the application without a hearing pursuant to section 21(4)(b) of the Act since no other parties are adversely affected in a material way by the outcome of

the proceeding, and the applicant has consented to disposing of the application without a hearing.

I find that it is in the public interest to grant the requested amendment to Schedule 1 of the licence.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:**

Schedule 1 of the electricity generator licence EG-2003-0104 is amended to remove reference to the Sandy Falls, Lower Sturgeon and Hound Chute Generating Stations. The amended licence is attached to this Order.
