Your full page B7 seems to have some misleading information in your advertisement in the MILTON CHAMPION of November 13th, 2009 wherein the paper states over the printed signature of your Mr. JOHN PICKERNELL that a small residential customer of MILTON HYDRO will get a small decrease in their monthly bill of \$2.44 whereas your website www.errr.oeb.gov.on.ca, which I went on to-day, states that there will be an INCREASE of 0.2% in the bill of a residential customer's bill.

Obviously, there is some problem.

I went to the MILTON HYDRO OFFICE to view the application but the person who was responsible was not there nor has he/she contacted me to respond to my request to view the application. Also, I could not find the detailed application on your web site nor on the web site of MILTON HYDRO.

I would like to see the application to verify the truth.

Milton Hydro Distribution Inc.

The Ontario Energy Board has received an application on October 30, 2007 under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, S.O. 1998, c. 15 (Schedule B), seeking approval for changes to the rates that Milton Hydro Distribution Inc. charges for electricity distribution, to be effective May 1, 2008. The Board has assigned the application file number EB-2007-0854. The Board's decision on this application may have an effect on all of Milton Hydro Distribution Inc.'s customers.

Any change to the rates that Milton Hydro Distribution Inc. charges for electricity distribution will be reflected in the delivery charges. Delivery charges are one of four regular items on residential and general service customers' electricity bills and vary depending on the amount of electricity consumed.

Milton Hydro Distribution Inc. indicates that if the application is approved as filed, a residential customer consuming 1,000 kWh per month would experience an approximate 0.2% increase in the electricity bill. A small general service customer consuming 2,000 kWh per month and having a monthly demand of 50 kW or lower would see an approximate 0.5% decrease in the electricity bill.



NOTICE OF APPLICATION AND WRITTEN HEARING FOR AN ELECTRICITY DISTRIBUTION RATE CHANGE

Milton Hydro Distribution Inc.

The Ontario Energy Board (the "Board") received an application on October 23, 2009, under section 18 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, S.O. 1998, c. 15 (Schedule B), seeking approval for changes to the rates that Milton Hydro Distribution Inc. ("Milton Hydro") charges for electricity distribution, to be effective May 1, 2010. The Board has assigned the application file number EB-2009-0204. The Board's decision on this application may have an effect on all of Milton Hydro's customers. The application was filed under the Board's guidelines for 2nd Generation Incentive Regulation, which provides for a mechanistic and formulaic adjustment to rates between cost of service applications.

Any change to the rates that Milton Hydro charges for electricity distribution will be reflected in the delivery charges. Delivery charges are one of four regular items on residential and general service customers' electricity bills and vary depending on the amount of electricity consumed. Milton Hydro indicates that if the application is approved as filed, a residential customer consuming 800 kWh per month would experience an approximate 6.7% decrease in delivery charges. This is a \$2.44 per month decrease on the total bill. A small general service customer consuming 2,000 kWh per month and having a monthly demand of 50 kW or lower would experience an approximate 9.5% decrease in delivery charges. This is a \$6.70 per month decrease on the total bill.

Copies of the application are available for inspection at the Board's office in Toronto and on its website, www.oeb.gov.on.ca, and at Milton Hydro's office and may be on its website.

How to Participate in the Rate Proceeding

To the hearing. Your request for intervenor status must be made by letter of intervention and be received by the Board no later than December 9, 2009. Your letter of intervention must include a description of how you are, or may be, affected by the outcome of this proceeding; and if you represent a group, a description of the group and its membership. The Board will not award costs in this proceeding as the applicant has not made any proposals that deviate from the Board's guidelines for rate adjustments.

Intervenors and Submissions

Board-approved intervenors who wish information and material from Milton Hydro that is in addition to the evidence filed with the Board and that is relevant to the hearing shall request it by written interrogatories filed with the Board and delivered to Milton Hydro on or before December 15, 2009. Milton Hydro shall file with the Board complete responses to the interrogatories and deliver them to all intervenors no later than January 11, 2010.

Written submissions by an intervenor may be filed with the Board, and if so must be delivered to Milton Hydro and other intervenors, by February 1, 2010. If Milton Hydro wishes to respond to the submissions, its written response must be filed with the Board and delivered to all intervenors by February 22, 2010.
