# **Response**

Any research/studies undertaken by Government Ministries and agencies concerning proven or asserted claims made by identified Aboriginal Groups have not been requested or provided to Hydro One. Hydro One has discussed the claims made by the identified Aboriginal Groups with various Government representatives.

Hydro One's role in the identification process was to provide pertinent information about its Project to Government Ministries and agencies so that they could identify potentially affected Aboriginal Groups. Information provided by Hydro One generally concerned routing, construction and ongoing operational activities. Using this information, the contacted Government Ministries and agencies then provided Hydro One with the names

of Aboriginal Groups that they considered likely to be affected by the Project. These determinations were made based on information and expertise of the contacted Government Ministries and agencies.

Hydro One, as Project Proponent, has not had any reason to dispute or take further steps on its own accord to question or reassess the identified Aboriginal Groups. Please also refer to responses to Board Staff Interrogatories 6.1 parts (c) and (f).

Materials exchanged with the Government Ministries and agencies have been filed as part of Schedules A and B appended to responses to Board Staff Interrogatories 6.1.

Hydro One has held a number of public information centers along the proposed general route. As well, meetings with identified Aboriginal Groups to discuss issues of concerns have been held. A meeting also took place with the Métis Nation of Ontario on February 11, 2008. Further meetings are planned to facilitate discussion and understanding of whether, and if so, to what extent, the Project may potentially cause impacts to traditional land uses, harvesting patterns, customs, practices and traditions (e.g., food harvesting, gathering, cultural activities) of the Aboriginal Peoples living within the areas surrounding the Project.

Hydro One notes that further public consultation as well as consultation specifically with identified Aboriginal Groups is expected to continue throughout this proceeding as well as during the Project's environmental assessment. Hydro One is anticipating that conduct of the environmental assessment will proceed in an inclusive manner allowing appropriate opportunities for identified Aboriginal Groups to provide information and participate in the consideration of potential environmental and socio-economic effects.
