## Natural gas prices have changed

The Ontario Energy Board ("OEB") has approved changes to Enbridge Gas
Distribution's rates effective April 1, 2010.
For a typical residential customer, the changes will result in an increase of approximately $\$ 37$ annually. There is also a new Gas Cost Adjustment and two Rate Adjustments. The increase reflects higher natural gas prices in North America and changes to Enbridge's 2010 rates. The total effect on your bill will depend on how much gas you use.

## Gas Supply Charge

The Gas Supply Charge has increased from 19.9690 cents per cubic metre (" $\$ / \mathrm{m}^{3 "}$ ) to $21.1631 \$ / \mathrm{m}^{3}$. This price is based on a forecast of market prices for the next 12 months. The forecast price is reviewed every three months and adjusted accordingly. Enbridge Gas Distribution does not make a profit on the price of natural gas. If our forecasts are over or under our actual costs, we refund or collect the difference through gas cost adjustments.

There is a new Gas Cost Adjustment refund of $0.0460 \$ / \mathrm{m}^{3}$ for the period April 1, 2010 through March 31, 2011. Combined, the Gas Supply Charge and the refund result in a total effective Gas Supply rate of $\$ 21.1171 \$ / \mathrm{m}^{3}$.

## Transportation to Enbridge

The transportation charge has decreased by approximately $\$ 1$ per year for a typical customer due to lower costs for transporting natural gas through pipelines from Western Canada and the United States to Ontario.

## Customer and Delivery Charges

The cost of delivering natural gas to customers is included in both the fixed monthly Customer Charge and the variable 'Delivery to You' charge. The Customer Charge recovers fixed operating costs such as emergency response, meter reading, infrastructure costs and customer services that are not affected by the volume of gas used. 'Delivery to You' recovers variable operating costs, such as the cost of seasonal natural gas storage, as well as operating costs not recovered through the Customer Charge.

To better reflect the fixed costs of distributing gas, $\$ 24$ per year in fixed costs were moved out of 'Delivery to You' and added to the monthly Customer Charge. This results in an increase in the Customer Charge from $\$ 16$ to $\$ 18$ per month, or an annual increase of \$24, and a matching decrease of \$24 in 'Delivery to You'. However, variable costs have increased by about \$1 per year. Combined these changes result in a total annual decrease of $\$ 23$ in 'Delivery to You'.

## Rate Adjustments

The OEB has also approved two Rate Adjustments:
a. A refund to reflect the changes to the Customer and Delivery Charges in Enbridge's 2010 rates for the period from January 1 to March 31, 2010. For the typical customer, this will result in a refund of about $\$ 6$ in the month of April.
b. A charge to reflect the difference between the amount you paid for volumes consumed from January 1, 2008 to December 31, 2008 and the actual costs incurred. For the typical customer, this adjustment will appear in two equal installments of $\$ 4$ on April and May bills.

## Residential Rates

Charges for gas used from April 1, 2010 on will be calculated using the new approved rates as shown below. The annualized impact is based on a typical residential heating and water heating customer who uses 3,064 cubic metres per year.

The transportation charge has decreased by approximately $\$ 1$ per year for a typical customer due to lower costs for transporting natural gas through pipelines from Western Canada and the United States to Ontario.

## If you receive transportation service from your marketer

Your 'Transportation to Enbridge' charge will appear under the marketer portion of your Enbridge bill. In this case, the changes to the 'Transportation to Enbridge' charge described above do not apply to you. The rate you pay for transportation is based on the terms of your gas marketer agreement. For the Rate Adjustments as well, the transportation-related portion will not apply.

## Customer and Delivery Charges

The cost of delivering natural gas to customers is included in both the fixed monthly Customer Charge and the variable 'Delivery to You' charge. The Customer Charge recovers fixed operating costs such as emergency response, meter reading, infrastructure costs and customer services that are not affected by the volume of gas used. ## Natural gas prices have changed

The Ontario Energy Board ("OEB") has approved changes to Enbridge Gas
Distribution's rates effective April 1, 2010.
For a typical commercial and industrial heating customer, these changes will result in an increase of approximately $\$ 295$ annually. There is also a new Gas Cost Adjustment and two Rate Adjustments. The increase is primarily due to higher natural gas prices in North America and changes to Enbridge's 2010 rates. The total effect on your bill will depend on how much gas you use.

## Gas Supply Charge

The Gas Supply Charge has increased from 20.0868 cents per cubic metre (" $\$ / \mathrm{m}^{3}$ ") to $21.2486 \mathrm{\$} / \mathrm{m}^{3}$. This price is based on a forecast of market prices for the next 12 months. The forecast price is reviewed every three months and adjusted accordingly to reflect market changes. If our forecasts are over or under our actual costs, we refund or collect the difference through gas cost adjustments.

There is a new Gas Cost Adjustment refund of $0.0455 \$ / \mathrm{m}^{3}$ for the period April 1, 2010 through March 31, 2011. Combined, the Gas Supply Charge and the refund result in a total effective Gas Supply rate of $\$ 21.2031 \Phi / \mathrm{m}^{3}$.

## Transportation to Enbridge

The Transportation charge has decreased by approximately $\$ 7$ per year for a typical customer due to lower costs for transporting natural gas through pipelines from Western Canada and the United States to Ontario.

## Customer and Delivery Charges

The cost of delivering natural gas to customers is included in both the fixed monthly Customer Charge and the variable 'Delivery to You' charge. The Customer Charge recovers fixed operating costs such as emergency response, meter reading, infrastructure costs and customer services that are not affected by the volume of gas used. 'Delivery to You' recovers variable operating costs, such as the cost of seasonal natural gas storage, as well as operating costs not recovered through the Customer Charge.

To better reflect the fixed costs of distributing gas, $\$ 60$ per year in fixed costs were moved out of 'Delivery to You' and added to the monthly Customer Charge. However, variable costs have increased by about $\$ 35$ per year. Combined these changes result in a total annual decrease of $\$ 25$ in 'Delivery to You'.

## Rate Adjustments

The OEB has also approved two Rate Adjustments:
a. A refund to reflect the changes to the Customer and Delivery Charges in Enbridge's 2010 rates for the period from January 1 to March 31, 2010. For the typical customer, this will result in a refund of about $\$ 21$ in the month of April.
b. A refund to reflect the difference between the amount you paid for volumes consumed from January 1, 2008 to December 31, 2008 and the actual costs incurred. For the typical customer, this adjustment will appear in two equal installments of \$14 on April and May bills.
