Consultation on Transmission Project Development Planning

We are counsel to the Canadian Wind Energy Association ("CanWEA"). We are hereby giving notice of our client's intention to provide comments on Board Staff's discussion paper entitled *Transmission Project Development Planning* (EB-2010-0059), dated April 19, 2010.

Our client is a national, not-for-profit association that works on behalf of its members to promote the responsible and sustainable growth of wind energy in Canada. Its members include wind turbine manufacturers and component suppliers, wind energy project developers, owners and operators and a broad range of service providers. Our client is therefore interested in this consultation process because the development of transmission in Ontario will have a direct and material impact on its members.

We are also requesting cost eligibility on behalf of CanWEA. While CanWEA would normally not be eligible for an award of costs due to its inclusion in the list of ineligible parties under section 3.05 of the Board's *Practice Direction on Cost Awards*, in our submission special circumstances exist in this consultation that should allow for our client to be eligible. In particular, generators are customers of transmitters when it comes to the procurement of connections and related services and, in that sense, consistent with past Board practice in determining cost eligibility, they should be likened to consumers in the circumstances of this consultation.¹ Moreover, CanWEA and its members offer significant expertise and practical insight into matters that are relevant to the Discussion Paper and will offer comments that we expect will be of assistance to the Board in considering the issues raised through this process.
