**Re: EB-2010-0008 – Ontario Power Generation Inc. 2011-2012 Payment
Amounts for Prescribed Facilities**

Ontario Power Generation Inc. ("OPG") writes this letter in respect of the Letter of Intervention of The Society of Energy Professionals ("SEP") dated July 14, 2010 and the Notice of Motion of SEP of the same date in which SEP seeks an extension of the time limit for filing its Letter of Intervention.

OPG does not oppose SEP being granted intervenor status in this proceeding, on such terms as the OEB deems fit.

As a matter for the record, OPG disagrees with paragraph 2 (a) of SEP's Notice of Motion wherein SEP asserts that OPG did not serve SEP with the Notice of Application as required by the OEB's Letter of Direction dated June 4, 2010. In fact, SEP was served an English and French version of the Notice of Application on June 7, 2010.

The OEB's Letter of Direction directed OPG to serve all of the intervenors of record in OPG's last payment amounts case by email or registered mail, and the Letter specifically identified SEP. In OPG's last payment amounts case, SEP requested intervenor status by letter dated January 21, 2008 and requested that all communication to SEP and its representative be directed to Richard Long at the email address of longr@society.on.ca.

In serving the Notice of Application in this current proceeding, OPG served it by email to Richard Long at the email address referenced above. OPG did not receive any indication that its email to Richard Long was not successfully delivered.
