DECISION AND ORDER

- [1] This Decision concerns the appeal of Brant County Power Inc. ("Brant County") of the Board's Decision July 18, 2008¹ regarding the distribution rate to be charged by Brantford Power Inc. ("Brantford") to Brant County.
- [2] The appeal concerned a billing dispute between Brantford and Brant County concerning the rates that Brantford was charging Brant County for the delivery of electricity. Initially there were two rates at issue, the rate for distribution services and the rate for transmission services. In the Board's Decision of August 10, 2010 the rate for retail transmission was set based on prior agreement between the parties. The Board in that Decision² also dealt with certain procedural maters concerning notice and retroactivity as well as the starting dates for the two rates. This decision establishes the rate Brant County should pay for distribution services for the years 2008, 2009 and 2010.
- [3] Brantford proposes the following rates based on a revenue-to-cost ratio of 1:1.15 for 2008 and 2009, and 1:1.10 for 2010:

[4] The monthly service charge for the distribution service has been agreed to by the parties. It should also be noted that Brantford proposed that the revenue-to-cost ratio for 2010 should be 110%, a reduction from the 115% used for 2008 and 2009. This reflects Brantford's policy, which the Board adopted in recent Decisions moving the revenue-to-cost ratios for rates closer to unity.5

[5] Brant County, in response, proposes the following rates based on a revenue-to-cost ratio of one for all three years:

- [6] In determining the rate for Brant County, Brantford has used the following data inputs:
 - a) There are three connection points between BPI and BCP, at Powerline Road, Colborne Street West and Colborne Street East
 - b) The aggregated annual kW forecasted for BCP is 170,406 kW and the forecast at each of the three connection points is:

c) The starting point for the calculation of rates is a revenue in the amount of \$348,973.46 decreased from \$425,868.60. The \$348,793.46 revenue starting point results in a revenue reduction of \$76,895.14 to be recovered from BCP.

Brant County Agrees with these inputs

[7] Brant County submits that the rates proposed by Brantford will result in Brant County paying a subsidy of \$120,000 over the three years as set out below:

- [8] The main disagreement between Brantford and Brant County at this point is the appropriate revenue-to-cost ratio to be used for the 2008 rate. As indicated, the Board in its Decision of August 10, 2010 directed Brantford to file a rate within the range of 115% to 85%. Brantford has chosen 115%, the top end of the range. Brant County responds that because this is a new rate class the revenue to cost ratio should be one.
- [9] The guidelines that the Board follows in establishing revenue-to-cost ratios are set out in the Board's Report of November 2007.⁸ The Board notes at page 4:

"As the influencing factors are addressed over time, the Board expects that these bands will narrow and move closer to one.

The ranges established by the Board are set out in section 3, and are intended to be minimum requirements. To the extent that distributors can address influencing factors that are within their control (such as data quality), they should attempt to do so and to move revenue-to-cost ratios nearer to one."

- [10] The Board also noted that the ranges established in section 3 of the Report are intended to be minimum requirements and to the extent that distributors can address the influencing factors that are within their control, such as data quality, they should attempt to do so and move revenue-to-cost ratios nearer to one.
- [11] It is also clear at page 6 of the Report that the time frame over which the rates may move to a revenue-to-cost ratio of one may be influenced by factors such as rate shock and price stability.
- [12] The Board accepts that this decision does set a new rate class: namely a rate for an embedded distributor. The Board also believes that, to the extent possible, rates for a new class should start with a revenue-to-cost ratio of one unless there are compelling reasons to depart from that goal. One reason (and this is relied upon by Brantford) is potential rate shock. Brant County has calculated the subsidy that it would be paying over the three years if a revenue-to-cost ratio of 115% is used in 2008 and 2009 and 110% in 2010. That subsidy totals approximately \$120,000.
- [13] If the proposed subsidy is removed, Brantford's customers would incur an additional \$120,000 in costs. If the subsidy remains in place and the Board was to adopt a revenue-to-cost ratio of 115% as proposed by Brantford, the residential customers of Brant County would be subsidizing the residential customers of Brantford. We see no basis for this subsidy. The forecasted revenue from the residential customers is approximately \$9 million. It is apparent that an additional cost of \$40,000 a year will not cause rate shock. In the circumstances, the

Board accepts the argument advanced by Brant County and will fix the rate based on a revenue-to-cost ratio of one. The rate will effectively become:
