Dear Ms. Walli:

I am writing to express AMPCO's interest in participating in the Smart Grid Working Group.

AMPCO is a not-for-profit consumer interest advocacy organization. AMPCO's members represent a cross-section of Ontario's major industries: forestry, chemical, mining and minerals, steel, petroleum products, cement, automotive and manufacturing and business consumers in general. AMPCO members are major investors, major employers and a major part of communities in which we operate, across Ontario.

AMPCO, and its member companies, are well known to the Board. AMPCO participates in many proceedings, working groups, consultations and initiatives of the Ontario Energy Board. AMPCO members include IESO market participants and transmission customers, as well as large use and general service distribution customers. In fact, our membership is split almost equally between customers served at transmission voltage and those served by distributors.

AMPCO is always interested in issues related to the price, adequacy, reliability and quality of electricity service. While the implementation of smart grid technology will affect these areas, we are most interested is in the opportunities that can come with a well executed strategy to meet the customer control objectives provided in subsection 2(1.3)(b) of the Electricity Act.

AMPCO's members who are market participants have gained extensive and valuable experience operating in a dynamic, market environment in which IESO information systems and facility energy management systems, protections and controls are integrated. We are interested to work with the OEB, utilities and other stakeholders in the development of codes, standards and guidelines for smart grid implementation, to ensure that the lessons of the past can be transferred, and that the implementation of smart grid technology realizes its potential to facilitate greater participation and integration of large use and general service customers into Ontario's electricity market.

In AMPCO's previous proposals and submissions to the Board regarding transmission charge determinants, cost allocation and distribution rate design, we have consistently promoted the alignment of customer incentives with long term system cost to promote efficiency in supply and to promote efficient demand management. The policy and customer control objectives of the Minister's smart grid directive reinforce the government's support for these statutory objectives of the Board.

We nominate Wayne Clark to participate on AMPCO's behalf. Mr. Clark is AMPCO's technical consultant and is well known to the Board. His background in distribution system design, planning and operations as well as with information systems development provide a strong technical background in support of the working group activities. Moreover, Mr. Clark is also a member of the IESO Technical Panel that is involved in the development of market rules respecting the integration of renewable technologies into the Ontario electricity network, including embedded renewable generation. Outside Ontario, Mr. Clark also has experience as a technology coordinator for CEA Technologies, some of which activities included running workshops on distribution automation and developing a "technology roadmap" for future distribution systems. Mr. Clark's current CV is attached. AMPCO requests eligibility for Mr. Clark's costs in accordance with the Board's practice direction on cost awards.

We view the Working Group as a significant initiative of the OEB. The focus of its work is a priority for AMPCO. If the Board accepts our request to participate, we intend to participate fully and thoughtfully.
