Selection of Smart Grid Working Group Members

On January 13, 2011 the Board issued a letter seeking expressions of interest from those who would like to participate in a Smart Grid Working Group (SGWG). The SGWG will provide advice to Board staff on the technical aspects and related details to be addressed in the guidance to be provided by the Board in respect of the implementation of smart grid.

The Board received 48 nominations for the SGWG. Due to the number of nominations received, it is not possible to accommodate all interested participants. The Board thanks all parties that submitted nominations for their interest in this consultation process.

Based on these expressions of interest Board staff selected a representative group of twenty-five (25) parties. Each nomination was reviewed by staff and considered in relation to the following criteria.

The membership of the SGWG must:

represent a broad range of identifiable constituencies including electricity distributors, transmitters and generators, smart grid vendors and service providers, electricity retailers, telecommunications, ratepayers, and environmental interests:

- lend technical expertise in areas such as transmission and distribution systems' enhancement including the integration of distributed generation, standards and interoperability among smart devices, telecommunications, cyber security, storage and plug-in electric vehicles (PEVs); and
- be available to participate fully in each of the working group meetings.

The composition of the SGWG was selected to achieve an appropriate balance of among the above criteria, while maintaining the size of the SGWG at a level that will ensure its efficiency. As such, the SGWG will include one part-time member who will only be present for meetings in which their particular expertise will be required.
