Toronto Hydro Electric System Limited – 2011-2014 Board-Approved CDM Programs

INTERROGATORIES

Issue 1: Compliance with the CDM Code

1. In the Minister's directive to the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) dated March 31, 2010, the definition of CDM should be inclusive of load reduction from initiatives such as geothermal heating and cooling, solar heating and fuel switching for the purpose of load displacement. In developing its CDM program, did Toronto Hydro Electric System Limited consider incorporating these technologies? If Toronto Hydro Electric System Limited did not consider incorporating these technologies, why were these technologies not considered? If Toronto Hydro Electric System Limited did consider these technologies, but decided not to include these technologies in their CDM program, please explain why they were not included.
2. Currently the OPA is developing its own CDM program for Aboriginal communities on reserve. There are a large number of Aboriginal People living off reserve in Toronto. Did Toronto Hydro consider developing CDM program targeted Aboriginal People living off reserve in Toronto?

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
