REVISED RATE ORDER

Introduction

Enersource Hydro Mississauga Inc. ("Enersource"), a licensed distributor of electricity, filed an application with the Ontario Energy Board (the "Board") on October 15, 2010, under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, S.O. 1998, c. 15, (Schedule B), seeking approval for changes to the rates that Enersource charges for electricity distribution, to be effective May 1, 2011.

In its Decision and Order on the Application issued on March 17, 2011, the Board ordered Enersource to review the draft Tariff of Rates and Charges and to file with the Board a written confirmation assessing the completeness and accuracy of the draft Tariff of Rates and Charges, or provide a detailed explanation of any inaccuracies or missing information, within seven calendar days of the date of the Decision and Order.

On March 24, 2011, Enersource filed a letter noting a transposition error in the draft

Tariff of Rates and Charges with respect to the Late Payment Penalty (“LPP”) rate riders for the Small Commercial (including the Unmetered Scattered Load) and the GS < 50 kW rate classes. Enersource noted that the monthly fixed LPP rate rider for the Small Commercial / USL rate class should be \$0.13 and the monthly fixed LPP Rate Rider for the GS < 50 kW rate class should be \$0.67.

On April 5, 2011, Enersource indicated that upon a further review of the Retail Transmission Services Rates (“RTSR”) Adjustment Workform, Enersource found a discrepancy in the RTSR – Network adjustments between the former and the Rate Generator Model for the Large Use > 5000 kW and the Street Lighting rate classifications.

While the Board notes that with respect to its April 5th filing, Enersource did not comply with the Board’s prescribed timeframe of providing a detailed explanation of any inaccuracies in the draft Tariff of Rates and Charges within seven calendar days of the date of the Decision and Order, the Board will accept Enersource’s submission and has revised the Tariff of Rates and Charges.

THE BOARD ORDERS THAT:

1. The revised Tariff of Rates and Charges set out in Appendix A of this order will become final effective May 1, 2011, and will apply to electricity consumed or estimated to have been consumed on and after May 1, 2011. Enersource shall notify its customers of the rate changes no later than with the first bill reflecting the new rates.

Energy is supplied in single phase, 3-wire, or three phase, 4-wire, having a nominal voltage of 120/240 Volts. There shall be only one delivery point to a dwelling. Further servicing details are available in the distributor's Conditions of Service.

APPLICATION

The application of these rates and charges shall be in accordance with the Licence of the Distributor and any Code or Order of the Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Board, which may be applicable to the administration of this schedule.

No rates and charges for the distribution of electricity and charges to meet the costs of any work or service done or furnished for the purpose of the distribution of electricity shall be made except as permitted by this schedule, unless required by the Distributor's Licence or a Code or Order of the Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Board, or as specified herein.

Unless specifically noted, this schedule does not contain any charges for the electricity commodity, be it under the Regulated Price Plan, a contract with a retailer or the wholesale market price, as applicable.

It should be noted that this schedule does not list any charges or assessments that are required by law to be charged by a distributor and that are not subject to Board approval, such as the Debt Retirement Charge, charges for Ministry of Energy Conservation and Renewable Energy Program, the Provincial Benefit and any applicable taxes.
