The OPA has provided the requested information in Table 1 on page 2 of this exhibit.
Please note that there are no employees in the category of "outside consultants"
performing ongoing work within the organization, therefore this category has not been
included. Temporary employees are employed to fulfill short term needs for the
organization, such as temporary increases in activity or short term work that is not expected
to be ongoing in nature. To protect confidentiality, vice presidents and administrative staff
have been included in the category of "CEO and VP Office" to prevent disclosure of
individual salaries.

As noted in the response to Board Staff Interrogatory 1 at Exhibit I-1-1, OPA staff are not 16 assigned exclusively to one project, but move fluidly between multiple projects and across 17 multiple divisions. The evidence in Exhibits B-1 through B-5 demonstrates that there are 18 several initiatives within each strategic objective which do not directly correspond to the 19 reporting relationships in the OPA's organizational chart. The reporting relationships as 20 shown in the organizational chart remain relatively stable year-over-year, while the strategic 21 initiatives undertaken by the divisions change annually. Strategic initiatives are modified 22 based on Directives received from the Ministry or other organizational priorities as identified 23 through the business planning process. The OPA does not consider the categorization in 24 Table 1 to be illustrative of the costs of internal resources for its strategic initiatives. 25
