## RESPONSE 8

For clarification, due to the nature of directives from the Ontario Minister of Energy, the 9 funds (CEPP and AREF), including all program manager fees, are funded through the 10 global adjustment mechanism and do not form part of the OPA's revenue requirement and 11

resulting approved fees. 12

On September 24, 2009, the Ontario Minister of Energy and Infrastructure directed the 13 Ontario Power Authority to establish, through a third party, a Community Energy

14

Partnerships Program (CEPP) to facilitate the participation of communities in the 15 development of renewable energy generation facilities. In particular, the CEPP assists

16 communities in paying for some of the soft costs associated with the development of

17 renewable energy projects. The OPA funding cap for the program is \$10 million, which was 18

made public by the Ontario Minister of Energy in a directive to the OPA in November 2010. 19

As per the directive, this funding cap amount includes the program manager fees for the 20

fund. 21

The OPA competitively procured the third party program manager yielding a market-based 22 outcome. The OPA benchmarked the results from the procurement and determined that 23 the percentage of the costs associated with administering these funds is competitive and 24 consistent with other Canadian funding organizations. David Sharpe's "A portrait of 25 Canada's Charities: the size, scope and financing of registered charities" (Toronto: 26 Canadian Centre for Philanthropy, 1994), indicated that the average cost of administration 27 is reported at 15.5% of total expenditures. The Canadian Health Services Research 28 Foundation's "Administrative Costs of Research-Related Non-Profit Organizations", noted 29

that organizations with a budget less than \$20 million spend an average of 21% of the total 30

- budget on administrative costs. 31
- The percentage of annual budgeted administration costs for the successful proponent of 32 the procurement, Deloitte & Touche LLP (who sub-contracted Community Power Fund), is 33
- approximately based on the \$10 million annual cap. 34
- The September 24, 2009 directive to the OPA from the Ontario Minister of Energy and 35
- Infrastructure also included instructions to the OPA to establish the Aboriginal Energy 36

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- 1 Partnerships Program (AEPP). One of the three components of the AEPP is the Aboriginal
- 2 Renewable Energy Fund (AREF). This program, and subsequently the fund, is
- administered by the OPA, and not through a third party as this was not part of the directive.
