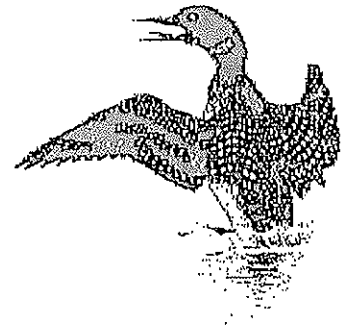

I am writing to you to remind Goldcorp that Lac Seul First Nation (LSFN), while not specifically opposed to Goldcorp’s proposed transmission facility project, cannot fully support the project until its consultation requirements have been properly addressed.

As you know, LSFN requested a 3rd party review of SNC Lavalin’s archaeological assessment in October 2010, and has not yet received confirmation from your client about when this will take place. Despite this outstanding item, Goldcorp is proceeding with a motion for interim relief before the Ontario Energy Board to commence work on the transmission line right-of-way prior to the outcome of its s.92 application.

LSFN remains concerned that the archaeological assessment conducted by your client’s consultant archaeologist is not in compliance with the Ministry of Tourism and Culture’s *Archaeological Assessment Technical Guidelines*, and did not anticipate the 2011 *Standards and Guidelines for Consultant Archaeologists* with respect to aboriginal engagement. The testing was conducted in LSFN traditional territory, in proximity to documented areas of archaeological interest, without any LSFN participation. Particular reporting criteria are absent from the report, specifically any mention of interval spacing between test pitting, and any conclusions as to the archaeological significance of test areas at the Chukuni water crossing – an area deemed to have archaeological potential. A 3rd party review of the archaeological assessment report would undoubtedly alleviate these concerns.

LSFN's support for this project is, of course, contingent on its consultation requirements being met, and as there remain to be matters outstanding it will not be able to lend its full support for this project. LSFN believes that the parties can resolve this outstanding matter, and hope to hear from you soon about how LSFN and Goldcorp can move forward with this issue.

We look forward to working with Goldcorp to support its development plans.
