AFFIDAVIT

I, Michael Carten, of the City of Calgary, in the Province of Alberta, MAKE OATH AND SAY:

- 1. On August 5 I filed an affidavit in connection with the referenced matter. Paragraph 15 of that affidavit is in error as to the sequence of certain events which while not material to the substance of my evidence bears correction. Paragraph 15 should instead read as follows:
- 2. "15. In late February 2011 we learned that Hydro One had notified certain of our customers and other project developers of potential delays in interconnecting projects in remote rural areas based on microFIT Technical Interconnection Requirement Document (TIR) which included a limit on connection of projects on a feeder where the total generation exceeded 7% of peak capacity. At the time we believed this to be an isolated matter which would not materially impact demand especially as many other customers continued to forecast growing demand in this market. In early April concerned that we might have misread the market, we conducted a regression analysis of data from the OPA website and concluded that there was a potential that the impact on demand from the peak capacity limit could be greater than our customers were predicting and we determined to engage in seeking a change from Hydro One. Since the rule is an extraordinary departure from world industry practices, we believed that we would be able to persuade Hydro One to revise the TIR to align with these standards. It was our belief that the Government also was likely not aware of the Hydro One departure from industry practices and would take action to bring the Hydro One position into line."
