## **DECISION AND ORDER ON COST AWARDS**

August 15, 2011

### **Background**

On July 30, 2010, the Board issued a letter (the “Letter”) regarding eligibility for cost awards in relation to participation in meetings of the Financial Assistance Working Group that began in August 2010. The Letter indicated that the Board determined that the participants identified in the Board’s June 17, 2009 Decision on Cost Eligibility (the “June Decision”) were considered eligible for costs in relation to participation in meetings of the Financial Assistance Working Group that began in August 2010 and were not required to submit a further request for cost eligibility.

Members of the Financial Assistance Working Group that were identified in the June Decision are: Consumers Council of Canada (“CCC”), Housing Help Association of Ontario, Low Income Energy Network (“LIEN”), The Salvation Army Centre of Hope (the “Salvation Army”) and the Vulnerable Energy Consumers Coalition (“VECC”).

The Letter also indicated that cost awards for participation on the Financial Assistance Working Group would be available for a maximum of 12 hours per meeting day, covering preparation, attendance and reporting time, and that the hourly limits would apply to each eligible party, and not to each individual participant acting on behalf of the eligible party.

On April 28, 2011, the Board issued a Notice of Hearing for Cost Awards in relation to this consultation process (the "Notice"). CCC, LIEN, the Salvation Army and VECC submitted cost claims by May 30, 2011.

No objections to the filed cost claims were received.

### **Board Findings on the Cost Claims of the Eligible Participants**

The Board has reviewed the cost claims and finds that the cost claims filed by CCC, LIEN, the Salvation Army and VECC are all within the approved overall limits set by the Board. The Board therefore finds that they are entitled to 100% of their reasonably incurred costs of participating in this consultation process.

The amount payable by each individual licensed electricity and gas distributor in relation to costs awarded to each eligible participant is listed in Appendix A to this Decision and Order.

### **Process for Paying the Cost Awards**

The Board has determined that costs should be apportioned between gas distributors and licensed electricity distributors based on the Board's Cost Assessment Model. This results in an allocation of 23.5% of costs to gas distributors, and 76.5% of costs to licensed electricity distributors. As noted above, these costs will then be allocated to each distributor based on their respective distribution revenues.

As stated in the Notice, the Board will use the process set out in section 12 of the Practice Direction to implement the payment of the cost awards. Therefore, the Board will act as a clearing house for all payments of cost awards relating to this consultation process. Invoices will be issued to distributors at the same time as are invoices for cost assessments made under section 26 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998* (the "Act"). The practice of the Board is to issue to each distributor one invoice that covers all cost

awards payable by the distributor for the relevant period. As a result, the invoice may cover cost awards payable in relation to a number of consultations, including this one.

**THE BOARD THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:**

1. The amounts to be paid by each individual distributor in relation to the costs awarded to each eligible participant are as set out in Appendix A to this Decision and Order.
2. The individual distributors listed in Appendix A to this Decision and Order shall pay the costs awarded to each of the eligible participants as set out in Appendix A.
3. The individual distributors listed in Appendix A to this Decision and Order shall pay the Board's costs of, and incidental to, this consultation.
4. Payment of cost awards and of the Board's costs referred to in paragraphs 2 and 3 shall be made to the Ontario Energy Board in accordance with the invoice issued to the individual distributor, and shall be due at the same time as cost assessments under section 26 of the Act are due.
