The Ontario Energy Board approved changes to the rates Union Gas charges its customers effective April 1, 2008. For most customers the total increase will amount to \$121.78 per year, based on an annual volume of 2,600 m³. The enclosed bill uses the new approved rates.

Gas Commodity

The gas commodity rate has increased by 3.2350 cents/m³ to 29.5614 cents/m³. This change reflects the increase in Union Gas' forecast cost to purchase natural gas for the next 12 months. For most customers, the increase in the gas commodity rate will amount to \$84.10 per year depending on the amount of natural gas used. You will see the new rate on the "**Gas Used**" line of your bill.

In addition, the change in the gas price adjustment is an increase of 1.3173 cents/m³. This change reflects the difference between the projected cost of natural gas that Union Gas expects to pay and the amount that Union Gas expects to recover through the current gas commodity rate over the next 12 months.
