

## Hydro One's Role in New Transmission


- Implement Transmission Solutions identified by the OPA
- Obtain Ontario Energy Board (OEB) Leave to Construct (Section 92) approvals
- Obtain Ministry of the Environment (MOE) approvals under the Environmental Assessment (EA) Act
- Conduct consultations with First Nations and Métis communities, stakeholders and the public
- Design and construct new facilities once approved

### Green Energy Act, 2009


- Aims to expand investment in renewable energy; create well-paying jobs; build a stronger, greener economy; make the transmission grid more efficient; create a culture of conservation.
- September 21, 2009 Ontario Government asks Hydro One to immediately proceed with planning, developing and implementing;
  - 20 major transmission projects across Ontario
  - Upgrades to enable distribution connected generation
- These projects/upgrades will enable renewable energy projects (FIT program), increase transmission system reliability and energy transfer capability

#### Ontario's Feed-in-Tariff Program - Background

- Launched in October, 2009
- Includes wind, solar, hydro and bioenergy resources
- Multiple program categories target a range of participants including individual homeowners, community groups, First Nation and private sector investors
- Strong response to date: over 900 applications in the first two months alone, totalling over 9,000 MW
- Applications have been received from all over Ontario, including 2,600 MW in northern Ontario



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
# Northwest Transmission Expansion Project Reference Corridor



## Northwest Transmission Expansion EA Terms of Reference

- Hydro One will make its draft Terms of Reference available for review and comments in May 2010 for 30 days
  - Draft ToR will be posted on project website and available in local libraries
  - Newspaper ads and newsletter will provide details on review process
  - Workshops are also planned
- Hydro One will submit the proposed Terms of Reference to the Ministry of the Environment (MOE) for review in the summer
