**Re: Orangeville Hydro Limited – Application for Service Area Amendment

We are in receipt of the letter dated September 10, 2012 from Hydro One Networks Inc. (“HONI”) requesting an extension to respond to Board Staff interrogatories.

Despite the fact that Procedural Order No. 3 clearly states that “late filings for any procedural steps will not be accepted”, Orangeville Hydro Limited (“OHL”) is agreeable to the Board granting the requested extension due to the importance and relevance of the interrogatories submitted by Board Staff. However, given the timing concerns expressed by the developer’s lawyer, OHL requests that the Board not change the remaining dates set out in Procedural Order No. 3.


Notwithstanding its position on granting the extension, OHL continues to be concerned that HONI is stalling the hearing process as raised in previous correspondence. The developer, via letters from its lawyer, has expressed the same concern. OHL submits that HONI’s excuse that it did not receive Board Staff interrogatories “due to difficulties with email exchange and the Board’s electronic web drawer service” is not a viable one. Our firm and OHL received a copy of the Board Staff interrogatories to HONI via email on September 4th. In the same email, these interrogatories were delivered to HONI at the same email address that they received the previous procedural orders and other correspondence from the Board. Board Staff’s interrogatories were also clearly posted on the Board’s web site.
