DECISION AND ORDER ON COST AWARDS
September 19, 2012

Background

Sioux Lookout Hydro Inc. ("SLHI"), a licensed distributor of electricity, filed an application (the "Application") with the Ontario Energy Board (the "Board") on May 4, 2012 under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act*, 1998, S.O. 1998, c. 15, (Schedule B), seeking approval for changes to the rates that SLHI charges for electricity distribution in relation to smart meter deployment, to be effective September 1, 2012. The Board assigned File Number EB-2012-0245 to the Application.

The Vulnerable Energy Consumers Coalition ("VECC") was granted intervenor status and cost award eligibility.

The Board issued its Decision and Order on the Application on August 23, 2012, in which it set out the process for VECC to file its cost claim and to respond to any objections raised by SLHI.

VECC's cost claim was received by the Board on September 7, 2012. No comments were received from SLHI.

The Board has reviewed VECC's cost claim and finds that VECC is eligible for 100% of its reasonably incurred costs of participating in this proceeding. The Board finds that VECC's claim is reasonable and SLHI shall reimburse VECC for its costs.

THE BOARD THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

1. Pursuant to section 30 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, SLHI shall immediately pay the Vulnerable Energy Consumers Coalition the sum of \$2,245.10.
2. Pursuant to section 30 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998*, SLHI shall pay the Board's costs of and incidental to, this proceeding immediately upon receipt of the Board's invoice.
