Please find below a summary for the rational of why or why not the aboriginal communities you identified were included in the s.14 list:

The Haldimand Tract and the 6 Nations of the Grand - Rights

Depending on the image used depicting the Haldimand Tract, this project is well out of...or well in the boundaries of the Tract. The Treaty narrative describing the area and historic image of the tract are not conclusive as they also suggest either boundary lines. While the list was generated using the less inclusive historic image of the Tract boundaries, the asserted area found on the 6 Nations of the Grand website shows the expanded boundary, and as such, the Ministry has identified the following two additional aboriginal communities who, in the opinion of the Director have or may have constitutionally protected aboriginal or treaty rights that may be adversely impacted by the project (s.14(b)(i):
