RATE ORDER October 11, 2012

Introduction

Niagara-on-the-Lake Hydro Inc. ("NOTL") filed its Deferred PILs claim as part of its 2012 Incentive Rate Mechanism ("IRM") Application (EB-2011-0186), dated September 15, 2011. The Board determined that NOTL's application for the disposition of Account 1562 – Deferred PILs was not consistent with the various decisions made in the course of the Combined PILS proceeding (EB-2008-0381). Accordingly, the Board determined that it would not hear the application for the disposition of Account 1562 – Deferred PILs as part of its 2012 IRM proceeding but would consider it on a stand-alone basis in a separate application to be filed by April 1, 2012. NOTL filed its standalone Deferred PILs application on February 29, 2012 (the "Application").

In its Decision and Order (the "Decision") on the Application issued on September 20,

2012, the Board ordered NOTL to file with the Board a draft Rate Order attaching a proposed Tariff of Rates and Charges reflecting the Board's findings, within 7 days of the date of the Decision. In developing its draft Rate Order, NOTL was directed to establish the rate riders based on a 19-month recovery period from October 1, 2012 to April 30, 2014. The draft Rate Order was also to include customer rate impacts.

On September 27, 2012, NOTL filed its rate rider calculations and a proposed Tariff of Rates and Charges. On October 2, 2012, Board staff filed a letter indicating that it had reviewed the material filed by NOTL and agreed that NOTL appropriately reflected the Board's findings in the Decision. Also, on October 2, 2012, NOTL filed a letter indicating that it no comments on Board staff's comments.

The Board has reviewed the information provided by NOTL and Board staff's comments on the proposed Tariff of Rates and Charges. The Board agrees with Board staff comments and is satisfied that the Tariff of Rates and Charges accurately reflects the Board's Decision.

THE BOARD ORDERS THAT:

1. The Tariff of Rates and Charges set out in Appendix A of this Order will become final effective October 1, 2012 and will apply to electricity consumed or estimated to have been consumed on and after October 1, 2012. NOTL shall notify its customers of the rate changes no later than with the first bill reflecting the new rates.

This classification applies to an account taking electricity at 750 volts or less where the electricity is used exclusively in a separately metered living accommodation. Customers shall be residing in single-dwelling units that consist of a detached house or one unit of a semi-detached, duplex, triplex or quadruplex house, with a residential zoning. Separately metered dwellings within a town house complex or apartment building also qualify as residential customers. Further servicing details are available in the distributor's Conditions of Service.

APPLICATION

The application of these rates and charges shall be in accordance with the Licence of the Distributor and any Code or Order of the Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Board, which may be applicable to the administration of this schedule.

No rates and charges for the distribution of electricity and charges to meet the costs of any work or service done or furnished for the purpose of the distribution of electricity shall be made except as permitted by this schedule, unless required by the Distributor's Licence or a Code or Order of the Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Board, or as specified herein.

Unless specifically noted, this schedule does not contain any charges for the electricity commodity, be it under the Regulated Price Plan, a contract with a retailer or the wholesale market price, as applicable.

It should be noted that this schedule does not list any charges, assessments or credits that are required by law to be invoiced by a distributor and that are not subject to Board approval, such as the Debt Retirement Charge, the Global Adjustment, the Ontario Clean Energy Benefit and the HST.
