Re: Ontario Power Authority 2013 Revenue Requirement Submission

As you know, Bill 75 was an act introduced to amend the Electricity Act, 1998 in order to amalgamate the OPA and the IESO into a single agency. It received first reading on April 26, 2012. On October 15, 2012, however, the Ontario legislature was prorogued, resulting in the termination of Bill 75.

Given this development, by letter dated October 30, 2012 attached, the Deputy Minister of Energy requested that a business plan update for fiscal year 2013 be submitted as soon as possible to the Minister of Energy for review. Pursuant to Section 25.22(2) of the Electricity Act, 1998, the Minister may approve the proposed business plan or refer it back to the OPA for further consideration. Once the Minister has approved the Business Plan, the OPA will submit its proposed 2013 expenditure and revenue requirements and fees for approval by the Ontario Energy Board.

Given that the OPA does not have an approved Business Plan for 2013 at this time and is therefore not able to submit its expenditure and revenue requirements and fees for approval, it is the OPA's understanding that the interim fees will continue in effect until such time as the Board makes a final order with respect to the OPA's filing for 2013.

Dear Mr. Andersen:

I am writing to address the 2013 Business Plan submission and approval process concerning your organization.

I would like to begin by thanking the Ontario Power Authority (OPA) for the work done to date to begin preparations for the proposed merger of the OPA and the Independent Electricity System Operator (IESO). However, on Monday October 15, 2012, the Legislature was prorogued resulting in the termination of Bill 75, the Ontario Electricity System Operator Act, 2012 at second reading.

Given this development, I am writing to both you and Mr. Paul Murphy, separately, asking that you submit a business plan update as soon as possible for each of your organizations for fiscal year 2013 to the Minister of Energy for review. Pursuant to Section 25.22 (2) of the Electricity Act, 1998, the Minister may approve the proposed business plan or refer it back to the OPA for further consideration. Once the Minister has approved the Business Plan, the OPA may submit its proposed revenues, expenditures and fees to the Ontario Energy Board for review.

Your letter dated October 1, 2012 requests that the Business Plan originally submitted by your organization relating to the 2012 fiscal year be accepted as your organization's submission for the 2013 fiscal year also. I would note that the Business Plan originally submitted by your organization relating to the 2012 fiscal year was not approved and was referred back to your organization within the time period provided for in s.25.22(3). For these reasons, I regret that I am not in a position to accept your request. In preparing a Business Plan that the Minister would be prepared to accept for review, I would ask that you undertake a careful fiscal review of your organization to ensure that today's economic realities are reflected, including identifying opportunities for cost savings and efficiencies, and making compensation decisions that are consistent with the government's policy direction to the Broader Public Sector.

In order to ensure that the approvals proceeds in an expeditious and efficient manner, I would expect that your staff communicate with Ministry staff to identify a common understanding of the submission and approvals process to be used given the unique circumstances.
