Veridian Connections Inc.

Veridian Connections Inc. ("Veridian") has applied to the Ontario Energy Board for approval to change its delivery charges beginning May 1, 2013. The application was filed on December 7, 2012 under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act*, *1998*, S.O. 1998, c.15 (Schedule B), under the Board's guidelines for 3rd Generation Incentive Regulation Mechanism which provides for a mechanistic and formulaic adjustment to distribution rates between cost of service applications.

Delivery charges are one of four regular items on Residential and General Service customers' electricity bills and vary depending on the amount of electricity consumed. If the application is approved as applied for, the monthly bill for a Residential customer who consumes 800 kWh per month would increase by about \$0.83 in the Main service area and increase about \$3.31 for customers in the Gravenhurst service area. The monthly bill for a General Service customer consuming 2,000 kWh per month and having a monthly demand of less than 50 kW would increase by about \$2.55 in the Main service area and increase about \$9.63 for customers in the Gravenhurst service area. The proposed changes to the Delivery charges are separate from other potential changes to the electricity bills, which are not affected by this application.

NDP MP says bye-bye to twitter

OTTAWA — A NDP MP with a history of Twitter outrage and shooting from the lip is leaving the Twitterverse after another profanity-laced thumb trade, but won't be disciplined for his latest meltdown.

Pat Martin — who is also the subject of a S5 million lawsuit for comments he made about a robo-calling firm — blew a gasker Wednesday night because he wasn't invited to a funding announcement in his Winnipeg riding.

In a series of Tweets, he told one participant to "I—off," said he was "fed up" with the "rat-faced whores" at the Conservative party, and regurgitated the sex life of political foe Public Safety Minister Vic Toews, the senior minister for Manifola

"Listen, I would never judge someone who screwed their babysitter for years or knocked up their secretary, so don't ask me to respect...," he said in one tweet, "Look ... Given the parliamentary ses-

sion we've just endured, the term 'rate laced whores' is using a great deal of restraint...,' he said in another. Martin had been flying under the radar for the last several months until he

radar for the last several months until he fell off the wagon over an announcement to build residential units for newcomers.

He used the perceived snub to rip into

a Christian group called Youth For Christ that has also received infrastructure funding. Martin doesn't like the group and calls them "fundamentalists" and Toews' "donors" and "buddies." Toews said Martin has been a failure

to his constituents and has been spreading lies about the group.

"It is beyond comprehension why he would attack an organization for its religious affiliations," Toews said.

The minister said the funding announcement that set Martin off was a federal-provincial arrangement with the

province picking up the larger share.
"Apparently not even the provincial
NDP government wants Pat at their
announcements," Toews said.
Karl Belanger, a senior official in NDP

Karl Belanger, a senior official in NDP Leader Thomas Mulcair's office, said the comments were "inappropriate and unacceptable."

"M_G Martin agrees and we under-

stand that he has decided to stop using his Twitter account," Belanger said, adding no further action would be taken. Julie Carmichael, Toews' director of communications, tweeted that Martin should seek anger management counseling and provided a guide to thera-

In his final tweet before deleting his account Thursday, Martin apologized.

"It seems some people shouldn't tweet so with this, I sign off," he thumbed for the last time, or not

Influenza activity high in Simcoe Muskoka

Doctors and health-care facilities are seeing increasing numbers of patients with flu-like symptoms in Simcoe and

with flu-like symptoms in Simcoe and Muskoka.

As of Tuesday, Dec. 18, five institutions in the area were also dealing with outbreaks of influenza. The steady rise in diagnosed cases in the last two weeks shows that Simcoe and Muskoka are following the trend for an early flu season seen across Ontario this fall. Locally, the case load can be expected to continue to rise, says Simcoe Muskoka associate medical officer of health Dr. Colin Lee.

"This is the first wave of influenza activities."

"This is the first wave of influenza activity this winter," Dr. Lee said. "We expect to see the incidence peak in one to two weeks, which unfortunately brings us into the busy holiday season."

Lee cautioned that the current circulating strain of flu in Ontario right now is one that has tended to be associated with more severe flu seasons over the last decade. Exclustrately, the strains as Mal

with more severe his seasons over the machine decade. Fortunately, the strain – an H3 type of influenza A – is covered by and matches well to this year's flu vaccine. It's not too late for people to get their flue better.

The health unit holds sufficie The health unit holds sufficient sup-ply of vaccines to provide to doctors, family health teams and pharmacies that have trained staff able to give the flu shot. A list of local pharmacies offering the vaccine can be found on the health unit's website, sincoemuskokahealth.org. The vaccine will have benefits that last beyond this particular wave, Dr. Lee added, since it's not uncommon for flu seasons to see a wave of influenza B crop up in the late winter or early spring. The health unit also stresses the need for other personal protection habits, such as frequent handwashing, adequate sleep, healthy foods and staying active. Those who feel they are ill should stay home, get lots of rest, drink plenty of fluids, cover up coughs or sneezes with their sleeve or tissues, continue with frequent handwashing and avoid contact with other people.

"It's a very unpleasant illness, but most people do not need medical attention while they are fighting the flu," Dr. Lee said. "It's important for people to understand this as we approach the holidays, when hospital emergency departments are already dealing with high levels of traffic." There is an online tool to help you decide whether you or a family member has the flu, and whether to stay home to recover or seek medical attention. It's located at ontario.cafful. ontario.ca/flu.

The flu assessment tool is linked to from the left side of the page and was created by the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care. People can also call the ministry's Telehealth line at 1.866-797-000 for one-to-one advice from a registered nurse. As an alternative to hospitals, there are walk-in medical clinics in most communities in Simco and Muskoka.

Family health team offices may also hold after-hours clinics. They can be located using the search tool at informuskoka.ca or by calling 211. O come, all ye takeout

There's a longstanding holiday tradition embraced every year by thousands of Torontonians: ordering Chinese when everything else is closed. (Delicious and easy!) So make like the chosen people and dial one of these restaurants for takeout or delivery on Christmas Day. BY KARON LIU

1. ASIAN LEGEND

Eat these ultra-messy Moo Shu Pork pancake wraps (\$15.95) in the privacy of your own home, where there's an endless supply of napkins. The takeout container is heavy on the filling (shredded pork, green onions, carrots, egg, and shiitake mushrooms), but not so much on the pancakes—get extra. Also, be sure to order the Shanghaistyle fried noodles (\$12.95), which come piled with shrimp, pork, and shredded vegetables fried to a golden brown. 418 Dundas St. W., 416-977-3909, and other locations. Delivery zone: East of the DVP (to Markham), it's the 401 to Lake Ontario; west of the DVP (to Dufferin), it's Eglinton to Lake Shore.



This small restaurant doesn't get as much love as some of its Chinatown neighbours, but the food is tops. The stir-fried beef (\$10.95), with chunks of green and red peppers and onion in a savoury black-bean sauce, is a safe bet if you're working with picky palettes; it can survive sitting in Styrofoam, as well. Balance out the beef with some stir-fried broccoli (\$11.95). Worry not, veggie-phobes-it comes topped with crabmeat. 369 Spadina Ave., 416-260-9988. Delivery zone: Bloor to Lake Shore, Bayview to Lansdowne.

3. SI CHUAN HOUSE CUISINE

An icy winter's night calls for a hearty meal with a jolt of spice. Ma Po Tofu (\$8.99) originates from the Szechuan province of China—its soft tofu cubes are cooked in a bright-red chili-andblack-bean sauce—and packs a wallop of fiery heat that will keep you toasty. Order a side of plain steamed rice (\$1.25) to soak it all up, and a side of steamed buns (\$3.99), which are more like dumplings than bready rolls. 394 Spadina Ave., 416-597-9333. Delivery zone: St. Clair to Lake Shore, Bayview to Dufferin.

4. YUMMY YUMMY DUMPLINGS

Easy to share and always comforting, dumplings make for cheap and tidy finger food. The steamed pork and pickled cabbage (\$5.50) and the pan-fried shrimp and cabbage dumplings (\$5.99) are terrific and come 12 to an order. But since Yummy Yummy is a northern Chinese restaurant, its specialty, pan-fried mutton dumplings (\$6.99), is a must. Tender with strong, earthy mutton (retirement-aged sheep) and crunchy carrots, these little devils can be embarrassingly addictive in a group setting. 75 Huron St., 647-859-8998. 5. SIMON'S WOK

VEGETARIAN KITCHEN Our veggie option: a heaping helping of pineapple and mockchicken fried rice—the "chicken" is made from wheat gluten and tastes like tofu (\$6.75). For an appetizer, try the cryptically named "assorted wheat gluten" (\$4 for a medium-sized portion), which are actually strips of seitan marinated in various sweet-and-sour sauces. Similar to tofu skins in texture, some pieces are doused in a curry sauce and others are bright red with a tangy sweet-and-sour flavour. 
