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Response 12

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The number of customers along Highway 56 between Rymal Road to the North and 15 Cemetery Road to the South (representing the boundary of Binbrook) is 213 customers. 16 This includes customers with addresses right on Regional Road 56 as well as customers 17 along Guyatt and Golf Club Road which are streets off of Highway 56 between Rymal 18 Road and Cemetery Road that are included in determining the urban cluster. The linear 19 distance measured from Rymal Road and Regional Road 56 to the intersection of 20 Cemetary Road and Regional Road 56 is 5.4km, however, the circuit kilometers, which is 21 10km is used to calculate the customer density not road kilometers. 22

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As per Hydro One's response to SEC IR 11, the new urban cluster is made up of 24 customers along Rymal Road between Fletcher Road and Highway 56, south on Highway 25 56 into and including customers in the Binbrook area. There are 2408 existing connected 26 customers in this defined area now. There are 286 customers included in the design for 27 Summit Park Phase 7. There are 172 customers in new Binbrook developments that have 28 been designed and based on the growth rate in the area over the past three years there will 29 be another 200 customers within the next seven months for a total of 3066 customers, 51 30 km of circuit and 60 customers/km. Given Offers to Connect are prepared well in 31 advance of houses being built, it made more sense to use the rate class that the customers 32 will be eligible for at the time they request a connection which will be Urban for Summit 33

Park Phase 7 based on the density study performed. 34

8 **Response**

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Hydro One does not have any additional detail regarding the enhancement investment to provide a loop feed to Binbrook. Our internal approval process is one where initial investment scenarios are developed using benchmark estimates in the development of a business plan that is approved by our Board of Directors. The investment scenarios are prioritized to maximize the mitigation of corporate risk. The approved funding level for system enhancements and modifications is \$50M for 2012 and \$62.4M for 2013.

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The Binbrook loop feed investment of \$2.8M (per our area study) is included in the above approved levels.

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As this investment has now moved to execution phase several releases will be made to the field to produce detail estimates, plans and designs. An example of the current release

under construction was provided at the hearing as Exhibit K2.4

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
