**AND IN THE MATTER OF** an application by Union Gas Limited for an Order or Orders granting leave to construct natural gas pipelines and ancillary facilities in the Town of Milton.

#### PROCEDURAL ORDER NO. 1 and COST ELIGIBILITY DECISION

Union Gas Limited ("Union Gas") filed an application with the Ontario Energy Board (the "Board") dated January 29, 2013, seeking approval to construct 750 meters of natural gas pipeline and associated facilities, including a standby compressor in the Town of Milton. The approximate cost of the project is \$200 million. Construction of the proposed pipeline is scheduled to commence in 2013. Union has also applied to recover the costs of the project from ratepayers once the project is completed in January 2016.

The Board has assigned file number EB-2012-0433 to this application.

The Board issued a Notice of Application dated March 5, 2013.

This application is related to two other applications that are currently before the Board: a separate application by Union to construct a natural gas pipeline in the Brantford/Hamilton area (EB-2013-0074), and an application by Enbridge Gas Distribution Inc. ("Enbridge") to construct two segments of natural gas pipeline in Toronto (EB-2012-0451). Information about these projects can be found on the Board's website at <u>EB-2013-0074</u> and <u>EB-2012-0451</u>.

# **Issues and Process Conference**

Enbridge and Union have both filed letters setting out their views on the appropriate process to be followed for the three applications. These letters can be viewed on the <u>Board's advanced regulatory document search website</u> by entering both EB-2012-0451 and EB-2012-0433 in the search field. Both companies recognize that while there are a number of interdependencies between the applications, there are also distinct and unrelated elements to each of the projects. The companies propose that the three applications follow parallel, but separate paths. The timing of procedural steps (such as an issues day and interrogatories) would be aligned to allow parties to explore the interrelated issues of the projects; however the three applications would not be combined and the non-interdependent issues could proceed separately and at their own pace. The Board is considering this proposal and is also considering an alternative whereby the applications would be combined, but the issues would be heard in a phased manner in order to separate the interrelated issues and the stand alone issues in each application.

The Board would like to hear submissions from parties on the appropriate process for the three applications. The Board also intends to develop an Issues List or Issues Lists for the applications.

An Issues and Process Conference will be convened at the Board on Friday, April 26, 2013. This conference will be open to all parties and Board staff, but will not be transcribed or attended by the Board panel hearing the application. The purpose of the Issues and Process Conference will be for parties to attempt to reach agreement on an Issues List and an appropriate process for the applications. With respect to process, the Board would like the parties to discuss the companies' proposals, the alternative described above, as well as any other options. In addition, specific procedural steps should be proposed. Board staff has prepared a draft Issues List to serve as a starting point for the issues discussion, which is attached as Appendix A to this Procedural Order.

The Issues and Process Conference will be followed by an Issues and Process Day held before the Board panel. At the Issues and Process Day parties will have the opportunity to make submissions on any agreement reached at the conference and any unresolved matters. Following the Issues and Process Day, the Board will make a final determination on an Issues List (or Lists) and the process to be followed in the applications.

# **Draft Issues List**

A draft Issues List has been included in Appendix A. Parties will be able to provide their comments on the draft issues list at the Issues and Process Conference and the subsequent Issues and Process Day.

# Decision on Intervenor Status and Cost Eligibility

The Board received a number of requests for intervenor and cost eligibility status. Subject to Union Gas filing any objections to the requests for intervenor status and cost eligibility, the Board's findings are outlined below.

The following parties filed requests for intervenor status, but not cost eligibility:

The Board will grant Frontenac intervenor status. The Board notes that Frontenac has stated that it may seek cost eligibility at a later date. Since no formal request has been made, the Board will not decide on Frontenac's cost eligibility at this time. However, the Board generally does not grant cost eligibility to individual landowners unless the proposed facilities are on their property or the utility requires access to their property.

The Board approves the requests for intervenor status and cost eligibility for each of the other parties listed above. The Board expects parties with common interests to coordinate their efforts so as to avoid duplication. In determining cost awards, the Board will consider whether parties with similar interests have coordinated their interventions sufficiently.

The Board considers it necessary to make provisions for the following matters related to this proceeding. The Board may issue further procedural orders from time to time.
