

Chuck Scott named 2013 Arts Person of the Year

"Jolly good" time was had by all at the 26th Annual Mayor's Luncheon for the Arts yesterday afternoon where the theme of the event was Rule, Britannia!

Close to 200 arts supporters mixed and mingled at the perennial gala that raises funds for the Brampton Arts Council (BAC), and took in the sights, sounds and tastes of Britain—including a life-sized telephone booth, a backdrop of London's cityscape, and a meal of risotto, Yorkshire pudding and English trifle.

Performer Vandy entertained guests before the BAC presented awards to those dedicated to the development of the arts in Brampton.

The pinnacle of the event was the announcement of the 2013 Arts Person of the Year—an award reserved for a person "whose involvement in the arts has had a significant impact in the development of the arts in the city of Brampton," states the BAC.

So the only surprise in naming local arts leader and internationally-acclaimed filmmaker Chuck Scott was that he hadn't previously had the honour.

"You've been a leader in so many areas of the arts... and a champion of arts and culture," said Mayor Susan Fennell to Scott, adding that with his "extraordinary career in the arts and in Brampton" it was hard to believe he hadn't already won the award.

"Your efforts have made you an effective and important community-builder," she said.

The longtime Brampton resident has spent most of his career telling stories on film about people and places around the globe.

He's travelled to more than 50 countries around the world to document more than 260 different stories, but has always returned to Brampton—the city he calls home.

After living here for 45 years, Scott has planted deep roots in his community both as a successful film producer/director, but also as an artist and local arts advocate.

"You can't participate in the arts without it being a team sport," Scott said in his acceptance speech.

And so this award brings an opportunity for his own story to be told.

Scott, 59, dove into community service at a young age, when in his teenage years he volunteered for local church groups and organizations. Growing up, his folks were involved in various community programs, and instilled in him a spirit of volunteerism at a young age.

"My dad always said it was important to give back to the community," he told *The Guardian*.

His interests, from a young age, always centred around the arts. At age 10 he started taking photographs; in high school he was involved with theatre and making super 8 films and slide shows. From there he began working at his skills in film.

In 1973, his love for filmmaking was anchored after making a film about the Nitty Gritty Brama Ching Wing Ding.

"When I was involved in all of these things I knew the arts was going to be my future," he said.

He went on to film school, and volunteered at a high school where he worked with an art class to make films.

A little later in life, he stepped away from the arts and his filmmaking career to help run the family business in property management. After five years, he knew he needed to be back behind the camera, capturing stories, and he made a three-year transition back to the arts and in 1988 started a production company, Caber Media. He's been running the company on his own since 1993.

Over the years, Scott has been a part of many groups in the local community. He was involved with the Brampton Board of Trade and served on committees for City Image, Marketing and After Business. He was a member of the Citizen Advisory Council in Ward 5, and worked with the Peel Lung Association as a volunteer and acted as chair for their Art Auction fundraising event for two years.

Around that same time, in the early '90s, he sat on the Brampton Arts Council board for four years, and served as vice president.

He also had a hand in the city's Theatre Advisory Board where he was directly involved in having the Rose Theatre equipped with one of the most sophisticated television set-ups inside a GTA theatre.

Hydro One Brampton Networks Inc. has applied to the Ontario Energy Board to increase the amount it charges by approximately \$0.13 each month for the typical residential customer beginning on January 1, 2014. Other customers, including businesses, may be affected as well.

The requested rate increase is tied to inflation (and other factors intended to promote efficiency).

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD IS HOLDING A PUBLIC HEARING

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) will hold a public hearing to consider Hydro One Brampton's request. We will determine whether Hydro One Brampton has used the applicable models and formulas as required by the OEB. At the end of this hearing, the OEB will decide on the appropriate rate changes.

The OEB is an independent and impartial public agency. We make decisions that serve the public interest. Our goal is to promote a financially viable and efficient energy sector that provides you with reliable energy services at a reasonable cost.

BE INFORMED

You have the right to information regarding this application and to be involved in the process. You can:

- review Hydro One Brampton's application on the OEB's website now;
- sign up to observe the proceeding by receiving OEB documents related to the hearing;
- at the end of the process, review the OEB's decision and its reasons on our website.

If you want to become an active participant (called an intervenor) in this proceeding, you must apply for intervenor status to the OEB no later than **10 calendar days** after the publication or service date of this notice, or the hearing will go ahead without you, and you will not receive any further notice of the proceeding. If you do not wish to become an intervenor but wish to give your opinion on the proceeding to the Board members hearing the application, you are invited to file a letter with your comments, which will be considered during the hearing.

The OEB does not intend to award costs in this proceeding as Hydro One Brampton has only made proposals of a mechanistic nature within the OEB's guidelines.

These proposed charges relate to Hydro One Brampton's distribution services. They make up part of the Delivery line — one of the five line items on your bill. Marie-Pierre et Pierre-Marie de retour dans une quatrième histoire presque vraie

Mary-Christine Thoun a créé les jumeaux Marie-Pierre et Pierre-Marie pour la collection Les Petites Histoires presque vraies, aux Éditions du Vermillon. Sa quatrième histoire s'intitule *Éclair*, nom que les jumeaux ont donné à un tania rayé ou petit suisse. Dans cette aventure, les deux enfants mènent une enquête

pour découvrir qui abime les roses de leur mère.

La devise des jumeaux est : « À nous deux, nous trouvons toujours au moins une solution à un problème. » L'enquête lance Pierre-Marie et Marie-Pierre à la poursuite du mystérieux individu, mais l'affaire des rosiers conduit les enfants à d'étranges découvertes. Leur garage, leur jardin, leur muret, leurs

rosiers et leurs framboisiers sont partagés par qui vous devinez juste en regardant la page couverture.

Mary-Christine Thoun s'amuse à inventer des drôles de noms pour certains personnages. Ainsi, la pépiniériste s'appelle madame Laverdure et le voisin qui imite le chant d'un oiseau se nomme monsieur Lemerle. Comme l'auteure emploie quelques

mots rares pour les jeunes de 7 à 9 ans – périscope, commi-vence, stratégique, s'emberlificoter, épicerie, etc. –, elle fournit de brèves définitions en bas de page.

En appendice, le livre offre d'abord un précié (cinq pages) sur le tania rayé. On y décrit son mode de vie, son caractère et son habitat. On apprend qu'une femelle a « une ou deux portées de quatre à six petits par année » et que ceux-ci quittent le nid maternel à dix semaines. Le tania rayé vit de trois à sept ans. Ensuite, l'auteure explique comment quatre « faits réels » ont inspiré sa

petite histoire presque vraie.

Les illustrations de Clémentine Pia sont un peu naïves; elles auraient gagné à être présentées en couleurs, mais le budget des Éditions du Vermillon ne le permettait sans doute pas, surtout depuis que le Conseil des Arts du Canada leur coupe injustement les vivres.

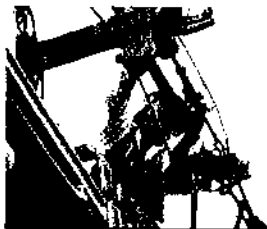

LOSS FACTOR

When electricity is delivered over a power line, it is normal for a small amount of power to be consumed or lost as heat. Equipment, such as wires and transformers, consumes power before it gets to your home or business. The adjustment factor accounts for these losses.

Residential Electricity Rates

For customers on the Regulated Price Plan's Time-Of-Use Pricing

The Ontario Energy Board recently announced new electricity prices for the summer months, from May 1, 2013 to October 31, 2013. Residential consumers on Time-Of-Use (TOU) Pricing will pay 6.7 cents per kilowatt hour during off-peak hours, 10.4 cents per kilowatt hour during mid-peak hours, and 12.4 cents per kilowatt hour during on-peak hours. *NOTE: Prices will be reviewed by the OEB and may be adjusted every six months.*
