Re EB2013 0-246

Please do not grant permission to Hydro One Networks Inc. to upgrade 25 kilometers of a currently idle 115 kilo volt electricity transmission line and build a 100 m connection to an existing transformer station. This line would connect a wind farm operated by Niagara Region Wind Corporation, and its associated electricity line to the provincial power grid. This to be done at the taxpayers' expense. If they want to reopen this line, it should be the responsibility of the wind proponent to pay for that expense: They will be making money on this line and the tax payer will have to pay for the added expense for power, but we refuse to pay for them to build the line as well.

According to Hydro One Networks Inc., in a feasibility study by John Sabiston, dated November 22, 2012, the proposal has technical problems and compromises the reliability of the grid. There are numerous other problems cited, those that I will not get into at this moment.

I respectfully ask you not to grant Hydro One Networks the permission to do this upgrade.
