ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD NOTICE TO CUSTOMERS OF ERIE THAMES POWERLINES CORPORATION

Erie Thames Powerlines Corporation has applied to raise its electricity distribution rates. Learn more.

Erie Thames Powerlines Corporation has applied to the Ontario Energy Board to increase the amount it charges by approximately \$0.15 each month for the typical residential customer beginning on May 1, 2014. Other customers, including businesses, may be affected as well.

The requested rate increase is tied to inflation (and other factors intended to promote efficiency).

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD IS HOLDING A PUBLIC HEARING

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) will hold a public hearing to consider Erie Thames Powerlines' request. We will determine whether Erie Thames Powerlines has used the applicable models and formulas as required by the OEB. At the end of this hearing, the OEB will decide on the appropriate rate changes.

The OEB is an independent and impartial public agency. We make decisions that serve the public interest. Our goal is to promote a financially viable and efficient energy sector that provides you with reliable energy services at a reasonable cost.

BE INFORMED

You have the right to information regarding this application and to be involved in the process. You can:

- review Erie Thames Powerlines' application on the OEB's website now;
- sign up to observe the proceeding by receiving OEB documents related to the hearing; at the end of the process, review the OEB's decision and its reasons on our website.

If you want to become an active participant (called an intervenor) in this proceeding, you must apply for intervenor status to the OEB no later than 10 calendar days after the publication or service date of this notice, or the hearing will go ahead without you, and you will not receive any further notice of the proceeding. If you do not wish to become an intervenor but wish to give your opinion on the proceeding to the Board members hearing the application, you are invited to file a letter with your comments, which will be considered during the hearing.

The OEB does not intend to award costs in this proceeding as Erie Thames Powerlines has only made proposals of a mechanistic nature within the OEB's guidelines.

These proposed charges relate to Erie Thames Powerlines' distribution services. They make up part of the Delivery line -- one of the five line items on your bill. Our file number for this case is EB-2013-0126. WRITTEN HEARING

The Board intends to hold a written hearing in this case. If you think an oral hearing is needed, you can write to the OEB to explain why.

If you write a letter of comment or sign up to observe the hearing, your name and the content of your letter or the documents you file with the OEB will be put on the public record and the OEB website. However, your personal telephone number, home address and email address will be removed. If you are a business, all your information will remain public. If you apply to become an intervenor, all information will be public.

This rate hearing will be held under section 78 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, S.O. 1998 c.15 (Schedule B).

■ MILITARY CONTRACT: U.S. Air Force expected to order 100 new planes at a cost of \$550 millio

WASHINGTON — Boeing Co. and Lockheed Martin Corp. will team up to bid on a new U.S. Air Force long-range bomber program, a multibillion-dollar project that U.S. Air Force officials have described as a top acquisition priority.

Boeing - which has played

a role in every U.S. bomber program since the Second World War — would be the prime contractor on the next-generation bomber program, with Lockheed as its primary subcontractor, the companies said on Friday.

The Air Force has said it plans to buy as many as 100 new bombers for no more than \$550 million each.

The Air Force had no immedi-

ate comment on the pact between the companies. Its estimate of \$550 million a plane reflects only the procurement cost of the new weapons, but not the cost of developing the plane or construction of new hangars.

In July, Defense Secretary Chuck Hagel vowed to protect several weapons programs, including the new bomber, if Congress failed to reverse man-
