How we are affected by outcome:

C4ST believes that forebearance on <u>pricing</u> regulation should occur and market-based pricing is in the best interests of residents of Ontario.

1. Cost-based pricing encourages the proliferation of antenna mounted on distribution poles in residential areas. Residents do not support this as it unfairly advantages the use of hydro poles for wireless attachment when other locations for wireless attachment may be more appropriate. Residents do not support a greater number of wireless attachments in their residential neighbourhoods.

2. Hydro customers should not be cross-subsidising the growth of mobile telephone companies. Mobile companies are among the most profitable in Canada. The move to a cost-based pricing for antenna will give mobile companies a discounted rate that will boost mobile profitability still further and at the expense of hydro customers. It is in the best economic interests of hydro customers for Hydro to charge competitive rates for wireless attachment.
