DECISION and RATE ORDER

March 13, 2014

Midland Power Utility Corporation ("Midland PUC") filed an application with the Ontario Energy Board (the "Board") on October 10, 2013 under section 78 of the Act, seeking approval for changes to the rates that Midland PUC charges for electricity distribution, effective May 1, 2014 (the "Application").

The Application met the Board's requirements as detailed in the *Report of the Board:* Renewed Regulatory Framework for Electricity Distributors: A Performance-Based Approach (the "RRFE Report") dated October 18, 2012 and the Filing Requirements for Electricity Distribution Rate Applications (the "Filing Requirements") dated July 17, 2013. Midland PUC selected the Price Cap Incentive Rate-Setting ("Price Cap IR") option to adjust its 2014 rates. The Price Cap IR methodology provides for a mechanistic and formulaic adjustment to distribution rates and charges in the period between cost of service applications. Midland PUC last appeared before the Board with a full cost of service application for the 2013 rate year in the EB-2012-0147 proceeding.

The Board conducted a written hearing and Board staff participated in the proceeding. No letters of comment were received.

While I have considered the entire record in this proceeding, I have made reference only to such evidence as is necessary to provide context to my findings. The following issues are addressed in this Decision and Rate Order:

- Price Cap Index Adjustment;
- Rural or Remote Electricity Rate Protection Charge;
- Retail Transmission Service Rates; and
- Review and Disposition of Group 1 Deferral and Variance Account Balances.

Price Cap Index Adjustment

The Board issued the *Report on Rate Setting Parameters and Benchmarking under the Renewed Regulatory Framework for Ontario's Electricity Distributors* (the "Price Cap IR Report") which provides the 2014 rate adjustment parameters for distribution companies selecting either the Price Cap IR or Annual IR Index option.

Distribution rates under the Price Cap IR option are adjusted by an inflation factor, less a productivity factor and a stretch factor. The inflation factor for 2014 rates is 1.7%. Based on the total cost benchmarking model developed by Pacific Economics Group Research, LLC, the Board determined that the appropriate value for the productivity factor is zero percent. The Board also determined that the stretch factor can range from 0.0% to 0.6% for distributors selecting the Price Cap IR option, assigned based on a distributor's cost evaluation ranking. In the Price Cap IR Report, the Board assigned Midland PUC a stretch factor of 0.45%.

As a result, the net price cap index adjustment for Midland PUC is 1.25% (i.e. 1.7% - (0% + 0.45%)). The price cap index adjustment applies to distribution rates (fixed and variable charges) uniformly across all customer classes. The price cap index adjustment does not apply to the components of delivery rates set out in the list below.

- Rate Riders;
- Rate Adders;
- Low Voltage Service Charges;
- Retail Transmission Service Rates:

- Wholesale Market Service Rate;
- Rural or Remote Electricity Rate Protection Charge;
- Standard Supply Service Administrative Charge;
- Transformation and Primary Metering Allowances;
- Loss Factors;
- Specific Service Charges;
- MicroFit Charge; and
- Retail Service Charges.

Rural or Remote Electricity Rate Protection Charge

The Board issued a Decision and Rate Order (EB-2013-0396) establishing the Rural or Remote Electricity Rate Protection ("RRRP") benefit and charge for 2014. The Board determined that the RRRP charge to be paid by all rate-regulated distributors and collected by the Independent Electricity System Operator ("IESO") shall be increased to \$0.0013 per kWh effective May 1, 2014, from the current \$0.0012 per kWh. The draft Tariff of Rates and Charges flowing from this Decision and Rate Order reflects the new RRRP charge.

Retail Transmission Service Rates

Electricity distributors are charged for transmission costs at the wholesale level and then pass on these charges to their distribution customers through the Retail Transmission Service Rates ("RTSRs"). Variance accounts are used to capture differences in the rate that a distributor pays for wholesale transmission service compared to the retail rate that the distributor is authorized to charge when billing its customers (i.e. variance Accounts 1584 and 1586).

The Board issued revision 3.0 of the *Guideline G-2008-0001 - Electricity Distribution Retail Transmission Service Rates* (the "RTSR Guideline") which outlines the information that the Board requires electricity distributors to file to adjust their RTSRs for 2014. The RTSR Guideline requires electricity distributors to adjust their RTSRs based on a comparison of historical transmission costs adjusted for the new Uniform Transmission Rates ("UTR") levels and the revenues generated under existing RTSRs. Similarly, embedded distributors, such as Midland PUC, must adjust their RTSRs to reflect any changes to the applicable Sub-Transmission RTSRs of their host distributor(s), e.g. Hydro One Networks Inc.

The Board approved new rates for Hydro One's Sub-Transmission class, including the applicable RTSRs, effective January 1, 2014 (EB-2013-0141), as shown in the following table.

2014 Sub-Transmission RTSRs

I find that these 2014 Sub-Transmission class RTSRs are to be incorporated into the calculation of Midland PUC's RTSRs. Accordingly the rate models that accompany this Decision and Rate Order have been updated to include these rates.

Review and Disposition of Group 1 Deferral and Variance Account Balances

The Report of the Board on Electricity Distributors' Deferral and Variance Account Review Initiative provides that, during the IRM plan term, the distributor's Group 1 account balances will be reviewed and disposed if the preset disposition threshold of \$0.001 per kWh (debit or credit) is exceeded. The onus is on the distributor to justify why any account balance in excess of the threshold should not be disposed.

In its Application, Midland PUC's 2012 actual year-end total balance for Group 1 accounts including interest projected to April 30, 2014 is a credit of \$342,855. This amount results in a total credit claim of \$0.0018 per kWh, which exceeds the preset disposition threshold. Midland PUC proposed to dispose of this credit amount over a one-year period.

In its submission, Board staff noted that the principal amounts as of December 31, 2012 reconcile with the amounts reported as part of the *Reporting and Record-keeping Requirements*. Board staff further submitted that Midland PUC's proposal for a one-year disposition period is in accordance with the Board's report.

Board staff also noted that Midland PUC's 2010 and 2011 rate year Global Adjustment (Account 1588, RSVA Power, sub-account Global Adjustment) rate riders ended on April 30, 2013 (EB-2010-0099). Board staff further noted that as per footnote 5 of the 2014 Continuity Schedule of the 2014 IRM Rate Generator Model, Account 1595 is only to be included for review and disposition if the recovery (or refund) period has been

completed. Additionally, Board staff noted that in this case, the recovery (or refund) period has not been completed as at December 31, 2012 for the previously mentioned rate riders. Board staff submitted that the claim amounts related to sub-account 1595 (2010) in the credit amount of (\$50,401) and 1595 (2011) in the debit amount of \$98,211 should not be allowed at this time.

In its reply submission, Midland PUC agreed with Board staff's submission and requested Board Staff to update its IRM Rate Generator Model.

Removing the above noted claim amounts results in a total credit claim of \$0.0020 per kWh, which still exceeds the preset disposition threshold.

I approve the disposition of a credit balance of \$390,665 as of December 31, 2012, including interest projected to April 30, 2014 for Group 1 accounts. The balance exceeds the disposition threshold and the balance in sub-account 1595 (2010 and 2011) has been removed. These balances are to be disposed over a one-year period from May 1, 2014 to April 30, 2015.

The table below identifies the principal and interest amounts approved for disposition for Group 1 accounts.

The balance of each Group 1 account approved for disposition shall be transferred to the applicable principal and interest carrying charge sub-accounts of Account 1595 pursuant to the requirements specified in Article 220, Account Descriptions, of the *Accounting Procedures Handbook for Electricity Distributors*. The date of the transfer must be the same as the effective date for the associated rates, generally, the start of the rate year. Midland PUC should ensure these adjustments are included in the reporting period ending June 30, 2014 (Quarter 2).

Rate Model

With this Decision and Rate Order, the Board is providing Midland PUC with a rate model, applicable supporting models and a draft Tariff of Rates and Charges (Appendix A). The Board also reviewed the entries in the rate model to ensure that they were in accordance with the 2013 Board-approved Tariff of Rates and Charges and the rate model was adjusted, where applicable, to correct any discrepancies.

THE BOARD ORDERS THAT:

- 1. Midland PUC's new distribution rates shall be effective or May 1, 2014.
- 2. Midland PUC shall review the draft Tariff of Rates and Charges set out in Appendix A and shall file with the Board, as applicable, a written confirmation of its completeness and accuracy, or provide a detailed explanation of any inaccuracies or missing information, within **7 days** of the date of issuance of this Decision and Rate Order.
- 3. If the Board does not receive a submission from Midland PUC to the effect that inaccuracies were found or information was missing pursuant to item 2 of this Decision and Rate Order, the draft Tariff of Rates and Charges set out in Appendix A of this Decision and Rate Order will become final. Midland PUC shall notify its customers of the rate changes no later than the delivery of the first bill reflecting the new rates.
- 4. If the Board receives a submission from Midland PUC to the effect that inaccuracies were found or information was missing pursuant to item 2 of this Decision and Rate Order, the Board will consider the submission of Midland PUC prior to issuing a final Tariff of Rates and Charges.

5. Midland PUC shall pay the Board's costs incidental to this proceeding upon receipt of the Board's invoice.

All filings to the Board must quote file number **EB-2013-0151**, be made through the Board's web portal at https://www.pes.ontarioenergyboard.ca/eservice/ and consist of two paper copies and one electronic copy in searchable / unrestricted PDF format. Filings must clearly state the sender's name, postal address and telephone number, fax number and e-mail address. Parties must use the document naming conventions and document submission standards outlined in the RESS Document Guideline found at www.ontarioenergyboard.ca. If the web portal is not available parties may email their document to BoardSec@ontarioenergyboard.ca. Those who do not have internet access are required to submit all filings on a CD in PDF format, along with two paper copies. Those who do not have computer access are required to file 2 paper copies.

RESIDENTIAL SERVICE CLASSIFICATION

This classification refers to an account where energy is supplied to customers residing in residential dwelling units. Energy is generally supplied as a single phase, 3-wire, 60-Hertz, having a nominal voltage of 120/240 Volts and having only one Delivery Point per dwelling. For the purposes of calculating customer connection fees, the Basic Connection for Residential customers is defined as 100 amp 120/240 volt overhead service. A residential building is supplied at one service voltage per land parcel. Street Townhouses and Condominiums requiring centralization bulk metering are covered under General Service Classification. Further servicing details are available in the distributor's Conditions of Service.

APPLICATION

The application of these rates and charges shall be in accordance with the Licence of the Distributor and any Code or Order of the Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Board, which may be applicable to the administration of this schedule.

No rates and charges for the distribution of electricity and charges to meet the costs of any work or service done or furnished for the purpose of the distribution of electricity shall be made except as permitted by this schedule, unless required by the Distributor's Licence or a Code or Order of the Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Board, or as specified herein.

Unless specifically noted, this schedule does not contain any charges for the electricity commodity, be it under the Regulated Price Plan, a contract with a retailer or the wholesale market price, as applicable. In addition, the charges in the MONTHLY RATES AND CHARGES - Regulatory Component of this schedule do not apply to a customer that is an embedded wholesale market participant.

It should be noted that this schedule does not list any charges, assessments or credits that are required by law to be invoiced by a distributor and that are not subject to Board approval, such as the Debt Retirement Charge, the Global Adjustment, the Ontario Clean Energy Benefit and the HST.

GENERAL SERVICE LESS THAN 50 KW SERVICE CLASSIFICATION

This classification refers to the supply of electrical energy to General Service Buildings requiring a connection with a connected load less than 50 kW, and, Townhouses and Condominiums that require centralized bulk metering. General Service buildings are defined as buildings that are used for purposes other than single-family dwellings. A General Service building is supplied at one voltage per land parcel. Further servicing details are available in the distributor's Conditions of Service.

The application of these rates and charges shall be in accordance with the Licence of the Distributor and any Code or Order of the Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Board, which may be applicable to the administration of this schedule.

Depending on the location of the building Primary supplies to transformers and Customer owned Sub-Stations will be one of the following as determined by the Distributor:

- 4,800/8,320 volts 3 Phase 4 Wire
- 7,200/12,400 volts 3 Phase 4 Wire
- 8.000/13.800 volts 3 Phase 4 Wire
- 16.000/27.600 volts 3 Phase 4 Wire
- 44,000 Volts 3 Phase 3 Wire
