This is a formal letter in writing dated March 24th - exactly 8 days from the decision on the possibility of a 40% increase on gas rates proposed by Enbridge.

I am emailing this message to you because there are currently multiple streams of investigations ongoing to confirm the legality of the OEB approving this rate hike - should this follow through.

This includes officially filed complaints to the Office of the Ombudsman, hired legal counsel to investigate the potential breach of constitutional rights - sectional and sub-section verification under Municipal, Federal and Provincial law - clause under CPA (Consumer Protection Act) and to confirm any other unfair legal business practices - this will be further verified under the BBB (Better Business Bureau). Exploratory options are currently under way to confirm the rights to impose legal action through the petitioning and coordination of a formal Class Action Lawsuit.

Due to increase public outcry - there will be accelerated momentum to crowd-source petitions in order to voice and express this serious concern - requesting the OEB to block the rate hike or at the very least to arbitrate on behalf of the public's ongoing concerns.

I trust that the OEB will exercise the proper due diligence before approving any such requests to increase rates. The OEB should take care of the general interest of the tax payers who funding OEB - to handle such regulatory approval matters.

Under FOIA - Freedom of Information Act, the rate decisioning process, the rate hike, and any other decisions may be scrutinized for fairness. I trust the necessary communications will be sent out to the general public as the process and decisioning makes it's way through the board.

I request a formal response on the matter within a reasonable time frame - and what the general public should expect. Although media outlets are monitoring the progress and status - I hope the OEB will be able to coordinate the message through the OEB website.
