Dear Members of the Board:

This correspondence is in support of the proposed interveners participation in the Ontario Energy Board hearings regarding EB-2013-0442. Before any decision is reached determining the location of distribution facilities within road allowances owned by The Municipality of Kawartha Lakes all sides of any and all issues must be presented to the board. I feel that the input from "persons who have an interest in the electricity industry" will provide more of a voice for concerned local residents and provide a much needed counter balance to the power, wealth and rhetoric of Industrial Wind proponents and their supporters.

As it is my understanding that the Ontario Energy Board is statutorily obliged to ensure that any proposed work be in the best interest of the public and consumers, I feel that all qualified voices, from all sides should be heard.

With such an incredibly streamlined and one sided approval process, it seems to me that in order for the Government of Ontario to fulfill its own policy of "ensuring high safety and environmental standards", presentations must be accepted from opposing interests.

The fact that WPD has failed to inform the public about the application before the OEB when originally posted, did not post a public notice in any local media or create dialog with immediate landowners indicates to me that Industrial Wind is reluctant to make the public aware of what is happening to their Ontario Government protected Oak Ridge Moraine. It also indicates to me that Industrial Wind would prefer to carry on without any public oversight, input or interference, all the while touting how beneficial Industrial Wind Factories scattered between their families' homes will be.

In closing, considering the tactics of WPD. I am taking this opportunity to support the interveners approval in the OEB hearing process.
