## RATE ORDER December 18, 2014

St. Thomas Energy Inc. ("St. Thomas Energy") filed a complete application with the Ontario Energy Board (the "Board") on June 26, 2014 under section 78 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act*, *1998*, S.O. 1998, c. 15, (Schedule B), seeking approval for rates and other charges for electricity distribution, to be effective January 1, 2015.

The Energy Probe Research Foundation ("Energy Probe"), the Vulnerable Energy Consumers Coalition ("VECC") and the School Energy Coalition ("SEC") were intervenors that participated in the proceeding. The intervenors and St. Thomas Energy filed a Settlement Proposal with the Board to settle all the issues in the proceeding. Board staff participated in the settlement conference and supported the Settlement Proposal.

The Board issued a Decision and Order on November 27, 2014 which accepted the Settlement Proposal and ordered St. Thomas Energy to file a draft Rate Order reflecting

the Board's findings. The intervenors and Board staff were provided with the opportunity to comment on the draft Rate Order.

St. Thomas Energy filed a draft Rate Order and supporting material with the Board on December 3, 2014. After filing the draft Rate Order, St. Thomas Energy filed a letter to explain that the \$10.00 microFIT service charge included in the draft had not been explicitly addressed in the Settlement Proposal approved by the Board. However, St. Thomas Energy indicated that the \$10 charge had been discussed during the technical conference as it represented an increase over the current rate, and that it was embedded in the calculations included in the Settlement Proposal.

Energy Probe, VECC and Board staff filed letters supporting the \$10 microFIT service charge.

In addition, Energy Probe requested a table showing a breakdown of the Deferral and Variance account balances for disposition by account. Board staff requested that St. Thomas Energy update its Retail Transmission Service Rates Workform to incorporate the billing determinants from its most recent Reporting and Record Keeping Requirements filing. Board staff also requested that St. Thomas Energy file an updated revenue reconciliation calculation as well as a derivation for the base rates proposed in the draft Rate Order.

St. Thomas Energy filed a reply on December 11, 2014 that provided the additional information and calculations requested by Energy Probe and Board staff.

The Board has reviewed the material provided in support of the draft Rate Order and is satisfied that it accurately reflects the Board's Decision in approving the Settlement Proposal. The Board approves the \$10 microFIT service charge, given that it was embedded within the tables included with the Settlement Proposal, and noting that it is supported by the intervenors and Board staff.

### THE BOARD ORDERS THAT:

 The Tariff of Rates and Charges set out in Appendix A to this Rate Order will apply to electricity consumed or estimated to have been consumed on and after January 1, 2015. St. Thomas Energy shall notify its customers of the rate changes either before or with the first customer bills reflecting the new rates. DATED at Toronto, December 18, 2014

# **RESIDENTIAL SERVICE CLASSIFICATION**

This classification refers to an account taking electricity at 750 volts or less where the electricity is used exclusively in a separately metered living accommodation. Customers shall be residing in single-dwelling units that consist of a detached house or one unit of a semi-detached, duplex, triplex or quadruplex house, with a residential zoning. Separately metered dwellings within a town house complex or apartment building also qualify as residential customers. Further servicing details are available in the distributor's Conditions of Service.

### APPLICATION

The application of these rates and charges shall be in accordance with the Licence of the Distributor and any Code or Order of the Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Board, which may be applicable to the administration of this schedule.

No rates and charges for the distribution of electricity and charges to meet the costs of any work or service done or furnished for the purpose of the distribution of electricity shall be made except as permitted by this schedule, unless required by the Distributor's Licence or a Code or Order of the Board, and amendments thereto as approved by the Board, or as specified herein.

Unless specifically noted, this schedule does not contain any charges for the electricity commodity, be it under the Regulated Price Plan, a contract with a retailer or the wholesale market price, as applicable. In addition, the charges in the MONTHLY RATES AND CHARGES – Regulatory Component of this schedule do not apply to a customer that is an embedded wholesale market participant.

It should be noted that this schedule does not list any charges, assessments or credits that are required by law to be invoiced by a distributor and that are not subject to Board approval, such as the Debt Retirement Charge, the Global Adjustment, the Ontario Clean Energy Benefit and the HST.
