I am writing to protest the proposed installation of a large wind turbine project on Amherst Island.

Despite innumerable documents the proponent and yourselves have received outlining the danger and destruction a project like this would cause to the Island's people, wildlife, birds and heritage buildings, it seems nobody cares. The process is proceeding in the face of irrefutable evidence that there will be only minimal and intermittent power produced, while the Island will be forever changed from exquisite to industrial.

In particular, one island family will see the value of their cherished home plummet, due to the construction around them of turbines, a hydro substation, a cement batching plant, and a maintenance building.
