



3. A map showing the general location of the Proposed Pipeline, and associated facilities and

the municipalities, highways, railways and utility lines through, under, over, upon or across

which the pipeline will pass is presented at Schedule A.

The parties affected by this Application are the owners of lands, government agencies and

municipalities over which the pipeline will be constructed, and Union's distribution

customers with respect to quality of service and security of supply. The persons affected

by this Application are the customers resident or located in the Municipalities and First

Nations Reserves served by Union, together with those to whom Union sells gas, or on
