# Girl, 10, struck by fragments after shots fired at house

Girl did not require medical attention; police trying to determine whether home shot with pellets or bullets

OSHAWA -- Police are trying to figure out whether

OSHAWA - Police are trying to main out whether it was builtets or pellets that injured a 10-year-old girl when shots were fired through the front living room window of an Oshawa house. It happened as roughly 11:30 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 21 in the Dean Avenue and Normandy Street area. The shots fixed through the window bounced off a wall and fragments of it struck the girl, who was sixing on a couch.

The injuries, to her arm, were minor and she did not require medical attention.

Police found two holes in the window and they've

sent the projectile fragments for analysis.

Officers, including the factical unit and the Air 1 helicopter, searched the area but did not find any suspects. Police believe the shooting may be a case of mistaken identity.

Ochewe PUC Networks inc. has applied to the Ontario Energy Board with a plan to set the amount it charges for electricity distribution in each year beginning January 1, 2015 and ending December 31, 2016. If approved, the amount Ochewe PUC Networks charges each month for the typical residential customer using 800 kWh per month would increase by the following amounts:

2015	2016	2017	2018	2019
\$130	\$1.38	\$1.54	\$1.76	\$1.71

Other austomers, including businesses, may be affected as well.

#### THE ONTARIO EMERGY ROARD IS HOLDING A PUBLIC HEARING

The OEB will hold a public hearing to consider Oshawa PUC's request. We will question the company on its case for a rate increase. We will also hear arguments from individuals and from groups that represent Oshawa PUC's customers. At the end of this hearing, the OEB will decide whether the electricity distribution rates Oshawa PUC has applied for are reasonable.

If Oshawa PUC's application is approved, the OEB's review in the years 2016 through 2019 will be limited to ensuring certain annual adjustments are made in accordance with the approved rate plan.

The OEB is an independent and impartial public agency. We make decisions that serve the public interest. Our goal is to promote a financially viable and efficient energy sector that provides you with retable energy services at a reasonable cost.

#### BE INFORMED AND HAVE YOUR SAY

You have the right to information regarding this application and to be involved in the process. You can:

- review Oshawa PUC's application on the OEB's website now.
- file a letter with your comments, which will be considered during the hearing.
- become an active participant (called an intervenor). Apply by March 9, 2015 or the hearing will go shead without you and you will not receive any further notice of the proceeding.
- at the end of the process, review the OEB's decision and its reasons on our website.

These proposed charges relate to Oshawa PUC's distribution services. They make up part of the Delivery line - one of the five line items on your bill. Our file number for this case is EB-2014-0101. #### **ORAL VS. WRITTEN HEARINGS**

There are two types of OEB hearings - oral and written. The OEB will determine at a later date whether to proceed by way of a written or oral hearing. If you think an oral hearing is needed, you can write to the OEB to explain why by March 9, 2015.

If you write a letter of comment or sign up to observe the hearing, your name and the content of your letter or the documents you file with the OEB will be put on the public record and the OEB website. However, your personal telephone number, home address and email address will be removed. If you are a business, all your information will remain public. If you apply to become an intervenor, all information will be public.

This rate hearing will be held under section 78 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, S.O. 1998 c. 15 (Schedule B).
