We are writing on behalf of the Ontario Greenhouse Vegetable Growers ("OGVG").

The attached motion outlines our concerns regarding responses received from Union Gas in seeking understanding of alternatives that may be available to reduce the ratepayer impact of proposed project. In our view, responses provided to OGVG and other intervenors do not provide the Board with understanding of the realm of potential solutions considered and evaluated. In addition, the lack of information provided inhibits the ability of intervenors' to produce evidence that may be helpful to the Board.

With the technical nature of the changing pipeline dynamics in southwestern Ontario and particularly in the Golden Horseshoe<sup>1</sup>, it is difficult to understand the short and long term implications of changing flow patterns and the resulting impacts on the Ontario market. In addition, considering the inter-dependence of the utilities with TCPL in this area and complex relationship between physical and commercial solutions, we respectfully submit that a Technical Conference including TCPL would assist the Board in understanding these relationships and assure itself and ratepayers of the appropriateness of the proposed facilities.
