You have the right to information regarding this application and to be involved in the process. You can:

- review Union's and Enbridge's joint application on the OEB's website now.
- file a letter with your comments, which will be considered during the hearing.
- become an active participant (called an intervenor). Apply by [insert actual date 10 calendar days from the date the notice is posted on the applicants' websites] or the hearing will go ahead without you and you will not receive any further notice of the proceeding.
- at the end of the process, review the OEB's decision and its reasons on our website.
