**RE: EB-2014-0182-UNION GAS – Burlington-Oakville Pipeline  
OGVG FURTHER REPLY SUBMISSIONS ON MOTION TO COMPEL**

We are writing on behalf of the Ontario Greenhouse Vegetable Growers (“OGVG”) in response to the Union letter filed today in the above proceeding.

In its letter, Union asserts that the company “is best positioned to provide responses and clarifications required about its project and the alternatives available to it”. In our respectful submission, Union has already demonstrated, through its limited IR responses and “assumptions” stipulated in its submission on this motion, that it cannot assist the Board in providing evidence on the physical capabilities of the TCPL system in this area.

Further Union’s passive monitoring of TCPL open seasons in our view does not constitute the proactive development and assessment of collaborative solutions the Board has urged for infrastructure projects. If the review of available solutions is limited to those that the company has in its evidence, we submit the Board and ratepayers are hindered in the opportunity to ensure that the proposed solution is optimal in the public interest.

Therefore, we would urge the Board to include TCPL as witnesses in the Technical Conference to provide fact based evidence on the capabilities of its system to meet the needs of natural gas customers in this area.
