Queen's University celebrates its ing force behind the creation of Queen's and placement of two plaques to honour College in 1842 and was its first chair of the Board of Trustees.





You have the right to information regarding this application and to be involved in the process.

- You can file a letter with your comments, which will be considered during the hearing.
- You can become an active participant (called an intervenor). Apply by August 25, 2015 or the hearing will go ahead without you and you will not receive any further notice of the proceeding.

However, your personal telephone number, home address and e-mail address will be removed. If you are a business, all your information will remain public. If you apply to become an intervenor, all information will be public.

This hearing will be held under section 36 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998, S.O. 1998 c.15 (Schedule B).
