Results of previously conducted technical studies will be integrated in a shared vision model, which is a decision-making tool linking the hydrology and the water levels under different rule-curve scenarios to the various performance indicators so that options can be evaluated.

Building on the experience from other IJC studies in other watersheds, we are confident that the shared vision model, will capture the diversity of interests and impacts of this complex basin" said U.S. Commissioner Rich Moy, adding "the shared vision model will also be used to evaluate the performance of the rule curves under various climate change scenarios".

The bi-national Board will oversee the evaluation work, manage outreach and stakeholder engagement,

reports and provide recommendations to the IJC, which may include recommended modifications to the existing 2000 Rule Curves, depending on the modelled performance of rule curve alternatives.

#### How to Report a bear problem Emergency encounters

-Call 911 or local police, if a bear poses an immediate threat to personal safety:

-enters a school yard when school is in session

-enters or tries to enter a residence

-wanders into a public gathering

-kills livestock/pets and lingers at the site

#### Non-emergency encounters

Call the Bear Wise reporting line: 1-866-514-2327 (April 1-November 30) ff a bear is:

-roaming around, checking garbage cans

-breaking into a shed where garbage or food is stored in a

-pulling down a bird feeder or knocking over a barbecue

-moving through a backyard or field but is not lingering

### How to prevent encounters

 Never purposely feed bears (or other wildlife) or try to approach them.

## Limit food sources

-put garbage in containers that have tight-fitting lids, and put them out only on the morning of garbage day, not the night before (you can purchase specially designed bearresistant containers, which work best)

-take garbage to the dump often, if you do not have curbside pick-up

-frequently wash garbage cans, recycling containers and lids with a strong-smelling disinfectant

-fill bird feeders only through the winter months

-put away feeders in the spring and instead, offer birds natural alternatives (e.g., flowers, nesting boxes, fresh water)

-do not leave pet food out-

Union Gas Limited has applied for approval to change its gas commodity, storage and transportation rates effective January 1, 2016.

Union Gas Limited has applied to change its rates to better reflect how it supplies natural gas to its customers. The proposed changes include the following:

- A change in the reference price used to set rates on a quarterly basis for a majority of its customers; and
- A change to how it allocates costs to the different types of customers that it serves.

An average residential customer would see the following annual bill impact, but these impacts would only start in 2018:

Other customers in Union Gas Limited's service area, including businesses, will also be affected.
