Union Gas Limited has asked the Ontario Energy Board for approval to increase the operating pressures in its Bentpath East, Booth Creek, and Mandaumin natural gas storage pools above current operating pressures that were set in Ontario Energy Board's original conditions of approval. The storage pools are located in the Townships of Dawn, Enniskillen and Plympton, and the City of Sarnia all in Lambton County. The increase in operating pressures will allow Union Gas Limited to store more natural gas in each of the storage pools.

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) will hold a public hearing to consider the application filed by Union Gas. We will question Union Gas on the case. We will also hear arguments from individuals and from groups that represent the customers of Union Gas. At the end of this hearing, the OEB will decide whether to approve the application.

You have the right to information regarding this application and to be involved in the process.

- You can file a letter with your comments, which will be considered during the hearing.
- You can become an active participant (called an intervenor). Apply by [insert actual date 10 calendar days from the date the notice is posted on the applicant's website] or the hearing will go ahead without you and you will not receive any further notice of the proceeding.
- At the end of the process, you can review the OEB's decision and its reasons on our website.
