On Hydro Ones web site under "Understand Your Delivery Rates"

"A delivery rate is the price you pay to have your electricity delivered to your home. It covers the cost of maintenance, upkeep, and all the little things that go into making sure you have the energy you need, when you need it.

Hydro One includes the cost of delivering electricity to customer's properties on their bill under the Delivery Charge. The Delivery Charge represents 38% of your total bill

Residential and Seasonal customers pay different delivery rates. Select which category your property qualifies as to learn more about your specific delivery rates:

Hydro One states, as above "Hydro One includes the cost of delivering electricity to customer's properties on their bill under the Delivery Charge. **The Delivery Charge represents 38% of your total bill**". Who are they talking about in that stament when 2 lines later they state "residential and seasonal customers pay different rates". Are you kidding??
