

OSEA AND ITS INTEREST IN THE PROCEEDING

- 1 OSEA is a province-wide, non-profit organization centred on the vision of sustainable energy development. OSEA promotes the view that every Ontarian can be a conserver and generator of sustainable energy. OSEA is a public interest organization that works towards a sustainable energy future. This includes ensuring funding and rates that encourage both conservation and the incorporation of green energy.
- 2 OSEA is not a trade or industry association representing any specific product suppliers, generators, or specific generation technologies. Its membership consists of several non-profit/community organizations that advocate for a variety of interest groups including ratepayers. OSEA is not an association for energy generators. OSEA's membership is diverse with less than 16% being generators.



- 3 OSEA is Ontario's lead advocate, facilitator and catalyst for sector transformation and the transition to a more sustainable energy economy.
- 4 OSEA serves as an advocate for individuals, manufacturers, installers, developers, municipalities, First Nations, unions, farmers, co-operatives and other community organizations, NGO's and other associations supportive of, and engaged in, the full portfolio of sustainable energy solutions.
- 5 Sustainability refers to meeting our own needs and improving the quality of our lives while ensuring the ecological system that sustains us is healthy and capable of supporting future generations.



- 6 Sustainable energy involves the effective and efficient production and use of energy from an array of distributed sources matched in scale and quality to the end use. It isn't just about more electricity. It is about producing and using energy in a way that meets our needs and improves the quality of our lives while also ensuring that the ecological system that sustains us, our economy and society remains healthy and capable of supporting future generations indefinitely.
- 7 Sustainable energy includes:
 - conservation, energy efficiency and demand management
 - renewable heat and electricity generation
 - high efficiency combined heat and power (CHP) and district energy
 - energy storage
 - green buildings
 - smart-grids
 - transportation that is powered by hydrogen, electricity, human or animal energy, and other non-fossil fuels, and
 - community, public and commercial ownership of these structures

COSTS

OSEA seeks approval of costs in this proceeding. OSEA is a not for profit organization that is committed to representing the public interest on energy policy matters that contribute or impede energy conservation and sustainable energy development for Ontario.

OSEA's members, both individuals and organizations are interested in the development of sustainable energy in Ontario as consumers, individuals and citizens of Ontario. OSEA has been awarded costs by the Board in previous hearings, and the Board recognized that OSEA can provide "an important and unique perspective" in EB 2011-0118. OSEA can continue to provide an important and unique perspective in the current proceeding. OSEA does not have the funds of its own to allocate towards its meaningful participation in this matter.
